Second Lieutenant, 223rd Field Company, Royal Engineers. Died 13 May 1917. Aged 33. Son of Richard and Jane Taylor; husband of C.L. Taylor, of 5 Dixon Street, Longsight, Manchester. Born Holme, Westmorland. Formerly of the Royal Engineers (Singapore), came over to England in August 1915, and joined the British Army. Awarded the Croix de Guerre avec Palms (France). Buried in Lijssenthoek Military Cemetery, Poperinge, West-Vlaanderen, Belgium. Plot X. Row A. Grave 28.



TERRELL

Claud Romako à Beckett Terrell, MC *

Second Lieutenant (acting Captain), 15th Brigade, Royal Horse Artillery. Died of wounds 10 June 1917. Aged 33. Awarded the Military Cross (MC). Employed in Singapore by Drew & Napier. Son of Arthur and Georgie à Beckett Terrell, of 12 Fitzjames Avenue, Kensington, London, and Ashmansworth, Hampshire. Buried in Duisans British Cemetery, Etrun, France. Plot IV. Row J. Grave 9.

Assistant in Guthrie & Company. Killed by mutineers in Pasir Panjang Road on 15 February 1915.

Bernard Cuthbert Cameron ** ***

Private 9, Singapore Volunteer Rifles. Killed in action 15 February 1915. Aged 25. Son of David William and Hannah Cameron, of St Michaels, Cadwell Road, Paignton, Devon, England. Buried in Kranji War Cemetery, Singapore. Plot 37. Row E. Grave 19.

Frank Stuart Drysdale ** ***

Private 10, Singapore Volunteer Rifles. Killed in action 16 February 1915. Aged 18. Son of James Henderson Drysdale and Minnie Drysdale, of Singapore. Buried in Kranji War Cemetery, Singapore. Plot 37. Row F. Grave 8.

J.B. Dunn ***

Assistant in Guthrie & Company. Killed by mutineers in Pasir Panjang Road on 15 February 1915.

J.G.E. Harper ** ***

Lance Corporal 28, Singapore Volunteer Rifles. Killed in action 15 February 1915. Buried in Kranji War Cemetery, Singapore. Plot 37. Row F. Grave 14.

A.J.G. Holt ** ***

Private 36, Singapore Volunteer Rifles. Died 15 February 1915. Buried in Kranji War Cemetery, Singapore. Plot 37. Row F. Grave 17.

John Love Montgomerie ** ***

Second Lieutenant, Singapore Volunteer Rifles. Died 15 February 1915. Aged 37. Son of David and Agnes Montgomerie; husband of Katherine Jane Esther Fairweather Montgomerie, of Pitheavlis Bank, 98 Glasgow Road, Perth, Scotland. Born at Glasgow. Buried in Kranji War Cemetery, Singapore. Plot 37. Row G. Grave 12.

Donald McGilvray ** ***

Corporal 27, Singapore Volunteer Rifles. Killed in action 15 February 1915. Aged 25. Son of Donald and Jean McGilvray, of "Craigowan", Northampton Road, Croydon, Surrey, England. Born at Greenock. Buried in Kranji War Cemetery, Singapore. Plot 37. Row G. Grave 3.

Sergeant, (Reserve) Engineers, Singapore Volunteer Rifles. Killed in action 15 February 1915. Aged 28. Son of Alexander Wald; husband of Amelia Christina Holland (formerly Wald). Born at Adelaide, South Australia. Buried in Kranji War Cemetery. Plot 37. Row G. Grave 23.

Philip Walton ** ***

Gunner, Singapore Volunteer Artillery. Killed in action 18 February 1915. Barrister-at-Law. Son of the Hon Mr Justice Walton. Born at Adelaide, South Australia. Buried in Kranji War Cemetery, Singapore. Plot 37. Row G. Grave 24.

Dr E.D. Whittle ***

Medical doctor in government service. Killed by mutineers in New Bridge Road on 15 February 1915.

B.M. Woollcombe ***

Employed by Eastern Extension Telegraph Company. Killed by mutineers in Pasir Panjang Road on 15 February 1915.

Henry Graham Achurch *

Second Lieutenant, Royal Air Force. Died in aeroplane accident while night training at Belper, Derby County, England 24 April 1918. Aged 29. Employed in Singapore by Brinkmann's. Buried in St Neot's Cemetery, Huntingdonshire. Grave reference: C. 1833.

Keith White Adcock *

Lieutenant, Royal Engineers. Died 30 October 1918. Buried in Hitchin Cemetery, Hitchin, Hertfordshire, England. Grave Reference: Plot S. Row III. Grave A.

Evelyn Appleton *

Sergeant, 10th Royal Fusiliers. Died 5 July 1916.



BAILEY

Dermot Harvey Bailey *

Second Lieutenant, 1st/8th Battalion, Royal Scots. Died 23 May 1917. Aged 32. Employed in Singapore by Straits Trading Company. Son of Wellesley Cosby Bailey, of 20 Findhorn Place, Edinburgh and of Alice Anne Hargreaves Bailey; husband of Mary Jane Bailey, of 96 Viewforth, Edinburgh. Buried in St Nicholas' British Cemetery, France. Plot I. Row K. Grave 22.

Benedict Godfrey Allen Bell *

Second Lieutenant, 48th Squadron, Royal Air Force. Died 6 April 1918. Employed in Singapore by Asiatic Petroleum. No known grave. Commemorated on Arras Flying Services Memorial, Pas de Calais, France.

Duncan Campbell *

Lieutenant, Royal Field Artillery. Died 27 November 1918. Employed in Singapore by Paterson Simons.

Norman Leslie Critten *

Gunner 30776, 10th Brigade, Australian Field Artillery. Killed in action 8 August 1918. Aged 34. Manager of shipping in the Straits Settlements. He served in the Singapore Infantry and took a prominent part in helping to quell the riots at Singapore 1914. Son of Charles Peirson Critten and Anne Critten, of 68 Hanmer Street, Williamstown, Victoria, Australia. Enlisted Williamstown, Victoria, Australia. Educated in Victoria Government School. His brother was wounded in France 1916 and returned home where he was invalided out of the Army. Buried in Cerisy-Gailly Military Cemetery, France. Plot I. Row B. Grave 13.

Reginald Vaux Cuthbert *

Second Lieutenant, 8th Battalion, Seaforth Highlanders (Ross-shire Buffs, the Duke of Albany's). Died of wounds 28 April 1917. Aged 37. Son of Hugh Cuthbert and Anne Wilkinson Cuthbert. Buried in Duisans British Cemetery, Etrun, France. Plot IV. Row H. Grave 50.

Tom Dodimead

Private 255420, Royal Army Service Corps. Served with Egyptian Expeditionary Force in Palestine. Died at Alexandria of malaria contracted while on active service 2 November 1918. Aged 31. Engaged in business in Singapore. Son of the late John Dodimead of West Kirby, Chester, England. Buried in Hadra Military Cemetery, Alexandria.

Henry Pemberton Dudley *

Second Lieutenant, Royal Irish Regiment. Died 3 September 1916. Employed in Singapore by Hongkong & Shanghai Bank.

Victor Augustine Flower, DSO *

Lieutenant Colonel (Commonwealth War Graves Commission) or Major (Soldiers Died in the Great War), 13th Kensington Battalion, London Regiment. Killed in action 15 August 1917. Aged 40. Awarded the Distinguished Service Order (DSO). Employed in Singapore by Swan & Maclaren. Son of the late Sir William Flower; husband of Winifride Flower, of "Glencaird", Sheringham, Norfolk, England. Buried in Perth Cemetery (China Wall), Belgium. Plot I. Row E. Grave 20.

Percy Gold *

Second Lieutenant, Scots Guards. Died 21 July 1916. Employed in Singapore by Evatt & Company.

HENSON

Stanley Benskin Henson *

Second Lieutenant, 1st Battalion, Prince Albert's (Somerset Light Infantry). Killed in action 19 December 1914. Aged 27. Son of Dr W.J. and Mrs Henson, of 1 Albemarle Street, London; husband of Minnie Henson, of Elmsett Hall, Wedmore, Cheddar, Somerset. Buried in Ploegsteert Wood Military Cemetery, Belgium. Plot II. Row C. Grave 4. Extract from The Bond of Sacrifice Volume 1 September-December 1914:

He was educated at King's School, Bruton, and Pembroke College, Oxford, and obtained an appointment in the Colonial Police some six years before his death, being stationed in Singapore and Penang.

Soon after the declaration of war he resigned his appointment and returned to England. He had joined the Special Reserve of his Regiment as 2nd Lieutenant on probation in September 1913, and in November 1914 was attached to the 1st Battalion of his Regiment on going to the front.

The officer commanding the battalion gave the following details: "As to the manner of your son's death, I can only tell you that he died as a very brave man. He was leading his men in the attack on the German trenches, and had outstripped the rest of his company by about 20 yards, when he was shot through the heart and killed instantly. Those of his company who were fortunate enough to come out of the action alive speak in the highest terms of your son's courage. He is a great loss to the Regiment."

John Frederick Hornsey *

Lieutenant, Royal Army Medical Corps attached 6th Battalion, King's Shropshire Light Infantry. Killed in action 24 March 1918. No known grave. Commemorated on Pozieres Memorial, Somme, France. Panel 95.

Geoffrey Garnett Horsfall *

Sergeant 217, 10th Australian Light Horse Regiment. Killed in action 29 August 1915. Aged 31. Employed in Singapore by Saunders & Horsfall. Son of Alfred and Mary Horsfall; husband of Mrs Horsfall, of Clitheroe, England. Enlisted Broome, Western Australia. No known grave. Commemorated on Lone Pine Memorial, Gallipoli, Turkey. Panel 9.

Harold Allan Ironside *

Major, 96th Company, Machine Gun Corps. Died 15 October 1916. Employed in Singapore by Straits Trading Company. Buried in Bethune Town Cemetery, France. Plot III. Row K. Grave 42.



JUPE

Charles Eric Jupe *

Captain, 8th Battalion, Devonshire Regiment. Killed in action 26 October 1917. Aged 27. Employed in Singapore by Paterson Simons. Son of Mary Jane Jupe, of Lorraine, Winscombe, Somerset, England, and the late Charles William Jupe. No known grave. Commemorated on Tyne Cot Memorial, Belgium. Panel 38 to 40.

J. Kerr Black *

Captain, 7th Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders. Died of disease. Employed in Singapore by British American Tobacco.

Hector Alan Lane *

Lieutenant, 1st Battalion, East Lancashire Regiment. Killed in action 13 May 1915. Aged 25. Employed in Singapore by Sisson & Delay. Son of John Lane, of Cullisse, Parkstone, Dorset, England. No known grave. Commemorated on Ypres (Menin Gate) Memorial, Ieper, West-Vlaanderen, Belgium. Panel 34.

Jocelyn Henry Cambridge Lane *

Second Lieutenant, 4th Battalion, Coldstream Guards. Died 16 October 1918. Aged 34. Employed in Singapore by Caldbeck Macgregor. Son of F.G.A. and M.E.A. Lane, of Bloxworth House, Wareham, Dorset, England. Buried in Etaples Military Cemetery, France. Plot XLVIII. Row B. Grave 2.

Cecil Richard Langham *

Captain, 5th (Cinque Ports) Battalion (Territorial), Royal Sussex Regiment. Killed in action 16 August 1917. Aged 26. Employed in Singapore by Paterson Simons. Son of Colonel F.G. Langham CMG, and Frances Mary Langham, of Valehurst, St Helen's Park, Hastings, Sussex, England. Educated at Rugby, and Trinity Hall, Cambridge (BA). Returned from Singapore to serve. Buried in Vlamertinghe New Military Cemetery, Belgium. Plot VIII. Row E. Grave 4.

William Robert Norman Leslie *

Lieutenant, 1st Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Killed in action 25 January 1915. Aged 25. Employed in Singapore by Asiatic Petroleum. Son of Lieutenant Colonel William C.C. Leslie and Annie Elizabeth Leslie. Educated at The King's School, Canterbury. Buried in Brown's Road Military Cemetery, Festubert, France. Plot V. Row H. Grave 3.



MILLARD

Harold Millard *

Major, 7th Battalion, Northamptonshire Regiment. Died 11 April 1917. Aged 42. Employed in Singapore by Donaldson & Burkinshaw. A member of the Bar of the Supreme Court of the Straits Settlements and of the Federated Malay States. Honorary Secretary of the Singapore Bar Committee, the Straits Settlements Association, and the King Edward VII Memorial Fund. Captain of the Singapore Volunteer Infantry. Representative of the Straits Settlements at the Coronation of HM King George V in 1911. Born at Slough, Buckinghamshire, England. Youngest son of the late Rev F. Millard, BA Oxon, British Chaplain at Le Havre, France, and of Martha Amelia Millard. Served in Gallipoli and in France. Buried in Fosse No. 10 Communal Cemetery Extension, Sains-en-Gohelle, France. Plot I. Row C. Grave 39.

Lessels Malcolm Patterson *

Private 327591, 8th Battalion, Suffolk Regiment. Died 31st July 1917. Aged 32. Employed in Singapore by Borneo Company. No known grave. Commemorated on Ypres (Menin Gate) Memorial, Ieper, Belgium. Panel 21.

Captain Acting Major, 6th (Banff and Donside) Battalion (Territorial) attached 1st/5th Battalion, Gordon Highlanders. Died of wounds 23 March 1918, prisoner of war. Aged 32. Employed in Singapore by Hongkong & Shanghai Bank. Son of Lieutenant Colonel Robert Robertson, 5th V. Battalion, Gordon Highlanders. Buried in Grand-Seraucourt British Cemetery, France. Plot VII. Row A. Grave 2.

Frank Morton Springfield *

Private P.S. 1663, 16th Battalion, Duke of Cambridge's Own (Middlesex Regiment). Killed in action 11 January 1916. Aged 26. Born Ealing, Middlesex, enlisted London, resident Streatham, Surrey. Son of George and Mary Philip Springfield, of 291 Coldharbour Lane, Loughborough Park, London. Buried in Cambrin Military Cemetery, France. Plot/Row/Section E. Grave 7.

Thomas Stewart, MC *

Major, 5th Battalion, Royal Scots. Awarded the Military Cross (MC) and Bar. Employed in Singapore by Guthrie & Company.
