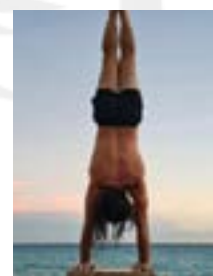


Creep AKA Michael Webb (FR #12)

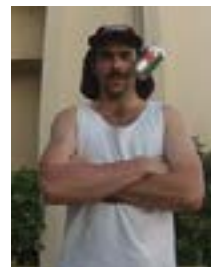
