PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear Members,

As the FIFA World Cup reaches its decisive stages, Stumps has been buzzing with members coming together to support their teams and enjoy the matches in the Club. We will continue to screen all World Cup matches live up to the Final on 20 July 2026. From the Quarterfinals onwards, Stumps will be manned for service for every live match. I warmly invite members to join us in the Club and be part of this atmosphere as we watch the tournament build to its climax.

Our Sporting Sections have enjoyed a remarkable run of success. The Rugby Section had much to celebrate. The SCC 1st XV claimed the SRU National League Cup, making this their third consecutive title; the SCC Lions also won the Shield, and the SCC Rugby Stingers emerged as Plate Champions in the TSG Phoenix Women's B Grade League I 2026 Touch Football Tournament. The Men's Hockey team has maintained its dominance with back-to-back national league titles. The SCC Bowlers performed tremendously at the Bowls Singapore National Pairs 2026 - our Men's teams took all three top spots in their category, while our Ladies took the Runners-Up position in the Ladies Category. The Squash Section delivered a landmark achievement with Kareena Sashikumar becoming the first Singaporean to secure an individual age-group title at the Asian Junior Championships. I am particularly proud of the growing number of Junior Sports Members across our various Sections, many of whom now represent both the Club and the national teams, reflecting the strength and depth of SCC's next generation of athletes.

It was a particular honour for the Club to be invited by the Royal Bangkok Sports Club to help celebrate its 125th anniversary. Our Snooker team represented SCC with distinction as Plate Runners-Up, The Snooker Section was joined by Tennis and Bridge to compete at RBSC and to strengthen our longstanding ties. As we look ahead to SCC's own 175th anniversary next year, we hope to mark our milestone with celebrations of similar calibre, befitting the heritage and stature of our Club.

On 12 June 2026, we were very proud to sign an MOU with Super Kings Academy (SKA), the global cricket development initiative of Chennai Super Kings (CSK), to establish the SCC Super Kings Academy. This landmark partnership will significantly elevate our cricket academy, providing our junior and senior players access to truly world-class coaching environment and international exposure.

We were particularly privileged to be joined at the signing ceremony by Ayush Mhatre, captain of India's Under-19 World Cup-winning team, alongside senior representatives from Super Kings Academy and Chennai Super Kings, underscoring the calibre and ambition of this collaboration.

The broader operating environment continues to pose challenges marked by global instability, rising costs of goods and services, and ongoing labour constraints. To respond proactively, management has focused on disciplined cost control by strengthening supplier negotiations, tightening food and beverage inventory management, reducing beverage stock holdings to improve cash flow, and streamlining the organisational structure to lift efficiency and productivity. Payroll remains in line with budget, and changes such as the revised Main Lounge operating hours are helping us deploy staff more effectively while maintaining member satisfaction. What is most heartening is that members continue to support the Club; this is reflected in revenue as at May 2026 being higher than the same period last year, giving us confidence that, together, we can further improve performance in the second half of the year..

I remain deeply grateful for your continued support and engagement, which are central to our success and to the vibrant community that defines our Club.

SINGAPORE CRICKET CLUB AND SUPER KINGS ACADEMY LAUNCH LANDMARK PARTNERSHIP TO ELEVATE SCC CRICKET ACADEMY

New Cricket Academy will bring world-class coaching to Singapore for Cricket Youth Development.

Singapore Cricket Club (SCC) has signed a landmark partnership with Super Kings Academy (SKA) - the global cricket development initiative of Chennai Super Kings (CSK), one of the most established and successful franchises in world cricket – to establish the SCC Super Kings Academy in Singapore.

This partnership will formally combine SKA's world-class coaching framework and the SCC Cricket Academy's local expertise in Singapore, opening a new chapter in SCC's and CSK's long-standing commitment to youth development and cricketing excellence.

SCC Cricket Academy: The excellence foundation for this partnership

At the heart of this partnership is the SCC Cricket Academy, set up in 2022 and long regarded as one of Singapore's foremost youth cricket programmes, engaging 360 junior cricketers across a structured three-tiered framework: Foundation, Development, and Elite.

With over 75% of its junior cricketers representing Singapore in national and development squads, the Academy is the country's primary feeder structure, underpinned by a longstanding partnership with the Singapore Cricket Association (SCA).

SCC BRINGS GLOBAL CRICKET BRAND - SUPER KINGS ACADEMY TO SINGAPORE

Launched in April 2022 as the official cricket development arm of Chennai Super Kings, SKA has rapidly grown to more than 45 centres across India, the USA, Australia, Canada, and now Singapore, cementing its position as a truly global cricket institution.

Built on structured development pathways, professional coaching certification, and CSK's global cricket network, SKA brings the infrastructure and brand equity to elevate the SCC Cricket Academy to an international standard.

THE NEW SCC SUPER KINGS ACADEMY'S OPERATIONS AND DELIVERABLES

The partnership will be run through a new franchise entity, Marina 2049 Pte. Ltd., providing institutional depth and a professionally governed platform for cricket development in Singapore.

SCC Super Kings Academy will operate across SCC's two premier facilities - the iconic Padang ground in the heart of the city, and the SCC Dempsey facility - offering a full complement of floodlit nets, turf and astro wickets, and competitive match environments.

WHAT THIS PARTNERSHIP DELIVERS

The new SCC Super Kings Academy for ages 6 to 23 years has been designed to create a step-change in cricket development outcomes for SCC members and beyond. Key deliverables include:

- Enhanced coaching quality through SKA-certified professionals aligned with CSK's development philosophy
- Coaching exchanges, international camps, and cross-border competition opportunities via SKA's global network
- Integration of a Girls' Cricket Pathway to expand inclusivity and representation
- High-Performance Training Blocks (U12–U16) focused on game intensity, conditioning, and tactical awareness
- Pathway Readiness Tests (PRTs) as standardised benchmarks across technical, mental, and physical parameters
- Expanded Coaching Development Programme to certify more internal coaches under SCA and SKA standards

Together, we will create stronger pathways, greater international exposure, and a truly world-class environment for the next generation of Singapore cricketers."

AN EXCITING NEW CHAPTER FOR SCC NETBALL

This year marks an exciting new chapter for SCC Netball with the relaunch of SCC Netball Academy, strengthening the Club's commitment to developing women's sport and creating meaningful pathways for young athletes.

The Academy has been reintroduced to provide a structured and supportive environment where young netballers can develop strong technical foundations, improve game understanding, and grow in confidence both on and off the court. Training is designed to support players at different stages of their development, from those new to the sport to athletes seeking to progress in a more competitive environment.

Led by coaches Bryan Ho and Jermaine, the programme brings together experience in school and youth netball with a focus on player-centred development, teamwork, and long-term growth. The emphasis is not only on performance, but also on building resilience, discipline, and a lasting enjoyment of the game.

The relaunch of the Academy reflects SCC's ongoing investment in women's sport and the development of netball within the Club. It strengthens the pathway for young players while helping to grow a vibrant and sustainable netball community.

There's been plenty for SCC Rugby Academy to celebrate this season. From strong performances in Singapore to standout success in Hong Kong, our players have shown what makes the Academy so special: commitment, resilience, teamwork, and a genuine love for the game. The past months have brought proud milestones for players, coaches and families alike, as well as plenty of accolades.

In April, SCC Rugby Academy was proudly represented by 10 teams, from U6 to U16, at the HKFC Youth International 10s. With strong local opposition, our players rose to the occasion, bringing home some impressive silverware. It was a fitting reward for the all the hard work shown by everyone on tour.

Back in Singapore, that momentum carried into the 2026 Junior Rugby Clubs Singapore (JRCS) league, where the Academy enjoyed another outstanding season. In a remarkable achievement, the Academy was represented in semi-finals across every age group from U10 to U17. Special mention for our U10s, who had two teams reach the semi-finals and our U11s, who made Academy history with three teams in the semi-finals. DARTS SECTION: MORE THAN JUST A GAME

The Darts Section continues to thrive as one of Singapore Cricket Club's most welcoming and engaging Sections. More than simply a game, Darts serves as a platform for friendship and meaningful connections among members.

A key philosophy of the Section is inclusivity. Members of all skill levels - from complete beginners to seasoned players - are encouraged to play together rather than be divided by ability. This creates a supportive environment where members can learn from one another, gain experiences, and enjoy the sport as a group.

HAPPY NEWS: AFFILIATE MEMBERSHIP TO DARTS ASSOCIATION OF SINGAPORE (DA)

The Darts Association has invited SCC to join as an affiliate member, with no membership fees /charge payable by the Darts Section.

One of DA's current initiatives is to organise friendly inter-club darts matches amongst participating clubs, thereby bringing together members from different clubs through friendly games and competitions, fostering stronger bonds across the wider sporting community. For those new to the sport, DA will be organising beginner workshops to help members gain confidence and learn the fundamentals of the game. They are also reaching out to other clubs and institutions including NUSS, Tanglin Club and SIA. To date, three clubs/associations have signed up, namely Serangoon Gardens Country Club, Police Sports Association and DA itself.

For SCC to participate meaningfully, we would ideally need a pool of approximately 10 players, with a minimum of five members required to represent SCC at each scheduled game. Once games are scheduled, it will run for about five consecutive Saturday afternoons. The proposed matches are expected to be held on Saturday afternoons. Actual dates, match fixtures, mode of play and timings are still being worked out and will be confirmed by DA in due course. This tie up is ideal as it will cater to new beginners/intermediate level players and the much better darts players who can play with others in the same level

This hopefully will bring our playing level up and we can develop a group of more competitive players

REST IN PEACE, RETNA SUBAPATHY

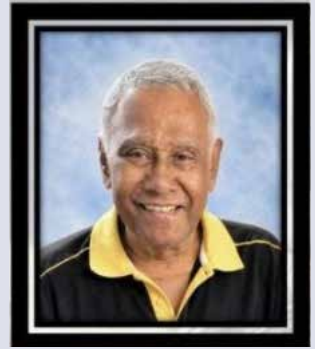
The ranks of our veteran bowlers are thinning. Over the past two years, we said goodbye to Chai and Robin. On 2 June, another familiar figure departed the stage when Retna Sabapathy passed on at the age of 78.

Retna was a sportsman. Hockey, Squash, Golf and Bowls claimed his allegiance at different stages of his life. After his O Levels at Raffles, he was one of the earliest cohorts to sign up with the SAF and was commissioned in the early 1970s. He served with distinction, including postings in Thailand, attended the prestigious Command & Staff course at Duntroon in Australia, and retired with the rank of Major.

Retna brought the same energy to civilian life. In his later years he could be found either on a golf course several times a week or at the Club pursuing his other sporting passion, Bowls. He collected a number of medals for Club tournaments and participated in overseas Bowls competitions – in Australia, Hong Kong and Bangkok. He served as Captain of the Bowls Section for several years and later contributed his time and expertise on the GC's Properties Sub-Committee with George Abraham.

A frozen shoulder some two years back forced him to surrender both golf clubs and bowls. We saw less of him around the Club thereafter, although he diligently attended AGMs and the occasional mid/end-of-year gathering. He never lost interest in the fortunes of the Club and kept a keen eye on club politics, hockey, golf and bowls.

To speak of Retna however, without mentioning his temper would be to leave the portrait unfinished. Retna had a volatile temperament and a very short fuse. Mention a new government tax or imposition of charges, an ill-conceived policy, or the name of someone who had earned his displeasure, and the resulting eruption and torrent of expletives could rival a minor volcanic event.



Yet those who knew him understood that beneath the gruff exterior was a generous and loyal friend. He was unfailingly kind to those he cared about and immensely proud of his family, especially his two sons. In his final months, Retna joked that he spent much of his day seated on his balcony, reading the newspapers and online stories and cursing all and sundry. It was classic Retna: equal parts commentator, critic and reluctant spectator to a world he believed had gone mad.

The Roman poet Horace observed that "**Pale Death, with impartial foot, knocks at the cottages of the poor and the palaces of kings**". Death comes to us all. But some leave behind a louder echo than others. Retna spent a lifetime refusing to keep his opinions to himself. The silence he leaves behind is therefore all the more noticeable.

May he rest in peace.

CONVENOR'S XI VS CAPTAIN'S XI INTERNAL TWO-DAY GAME: 4 - 5 APRIL 2026

In a fitting tribute to the demands of the longest format, SCC's finest squared off in a gruelling two-day contest between Convenor's XI, led by Aritra Dutta, and Captain's XI, under the command of Aman Desai. Played under some unrelenting Singapore heat, the game was as much a battle against the elements as it was against the opposition — a reminder, perhaps, of exactly why they call it Test Cricket. It tested everyone, the youth and the experienced alike, ensuring a cracking contest that proved, beyond any doubt, that this format deserves its place at the heart of SCC's cricketing calendar.

Long-format cricket has been largely absent from Singapore's club scene for some time now, and that absence has been felt. The skills it demands — patience, concentration, the ability to build an innings or a spell across sessions — are not ones that can be developed in the shortened formats alone. SCC, under the stewardship of the Section Committee, is committed to changing that. This two-day fixture is not simply a one-off occasion; it is the beginning of a deliberate and sustained effort to bring back a format that nurtures cricketers from the inside out, sharpening the very qualities that separate good players from great ones.

The contest itself unfolded in the finest traditions of long-format cricket, with neither side ever fully wresting control. Wickets, runs and resolve were all hard-earned across the two days, and what emerged was a showcase of the very best SCC has to offer — players of technique, temperament and character rising to a format that strips away all pretence and exposes the cricketer within. For the younger members of the squad in particular, the experience of navigating sessions, managing pressure across an extended game, and learning to read the ebb and flow of a match was invaluable.

It all came down to the final session. Captain's XI, requiring another 81 runs in the last hour of play to claim the bragging rights of an outright win, held their nerve magnificently, seeing the chase home with six wickets in hand. It was a fitting conclusion to a contest that had everything.

Beyond the result, though, the greater victory belongs to SCC as a club. Fixtures like this one serve a purpose far beyond bragging rights. They create the environment in which cricketers can develop the skills and mental fortitude required at the highest levels of the game, including for those with aspirations of representing Singapore on the national stage. The pathway to country begins in moments like these — in the heat of a two-day game, under pressure, learning what the longest format truly demands.



As stumps were drawn and the contest concluded, the players gathered at the Stumps Terrace for a well-deserved BBQ. Over food and good company, the rigours of the day gave way to the camaraderie that makes club cricket what it is. But the conversation, one suspects, will linger long after the last plate was cleared — of sessions played, of lessons learned, and of what it means to be part of something being built again.

SCC WOMEN'S CRICKET OPEN DAY 2026

On Saturday, 18 April, approximately 60 women and children descended on the Padang for a morning of Cricket hosted by the SCC Lionesses for the 2026 edition of the Women's Cricket Open Day!

For the 60 participants, whose experience ranged from complete beginners to seasoned pros, the SCC women's squad, supported by several Section Members and coaches, hosted fielding, bowling and batting drills suitable for all levels. The sun was shining, DJ Samu was on the decks, the kids were entertained with beginner cricket drills and some bouncy castle action... and hidden cricket talent was uncovered among many of our female participants!

The highlight of the morning was seeing the skills sessions put in action during the matches; despite the crippling heat and the calling of F&B waiting in the Courtyard, the competitive spirit prevailed. They couldn't get enough and needed dragging off the field!

On 10 May 2026, the Ladies' 1s beat ActiveSG Academy 2-0, with Rosalind Blazeczyk converting a short corner, and Janice Tan finding the second. The result kept us level on points with Jansenites.

The Ladies' 1s faced Tannibellies on 16 May 2026, a team boasting a good number of national team players in their ranks. Despite dominating proceedings, we were unable to capitalise, and our resolute defending kept us from conceding. We shared the spoils in a goalless draw.

On 23 May 2026, the Ladies' 1s beat Tornados in a hard fought win, coming back from a goal down to win 3-1. Barbara Mountain, Abigail Rhodes, and top scorer Rosalind Blazeczyk found the net and secured the points.

MHL2

Our Men's 2s had an exciting game against Barkerites on 11 April 2026, which saw both teams scoring 3 apiece and sharing the points. Goals from Ashvin Thevar, Danial Zikry, and Claudio Mastellone. However, we were unable to maintain our 3-1 advantage and conceded at the end of the 3rd quarter and beginning of the 4th quarter in a thrilling fixture.

Our Men's 2s played the final 14 minutes of their game against the Tannibellies which had been interrupted by the weather. Despite playing well against the league leaders, their obscene efficiency at penalty corners of 90% was too great an advantage to overcome, and we lost 3-0.

On 19 April 2026, our Men's 2s recorded a convincing 3-1 win over Police Sports Association who were missing key players. Jagdeep Singh opened the scoring with a deflection at the far post, Leonardis Chia picked up another penalty corner finish, and Ashvin Thevar scoring off a penalty corner variation.

We faced a Khalsa team that had been relegated from MHL1 the previous season and was largely intact on 26 April 2026. Despite a good showing, and a goal from Hizrul Iman, we were routed 4-1 by a superior side.

On 16 May 2026, the Men's 2s picked up a 2-1 win against Balestier Lions, with Kian Steenekamp finding a deflection off a defender from a drag flick for the first, and a tap in for the winner, following a mix up at the back from which Balestier Lions pounced. A gritty 2-1 win for the boys.

We faced the league leaders in Khalsa on 30 May 2026 and showed them we meant business. Though we defended stoutly, we were unlucky to concede right before the break. Alex Painter found the equaliser and as we pushed for a second goal but were unlucky with our finishing. Khalsa did find a winner at the death, resulting in a 2-1 loss.

WHL2

The ladies' 2s were plucky in their 9 May 2026 fixture against the Theresians who have a number of ex-national team players in their squad. We did well to pepper their goal with attempts but could not find a way past their ex-national goalkeeper. The Theresians found the goal from a penalty corner, and capitalised in the final quarter with a second, leaving us with a 2-0 loss.

The ladies' 2s went into their match on 23 May 2026 against Khalsa with all 3 goalkeepers unavailable. With 11 outfield players, Fleur Stamsnieder and Nan Nan scored, giving us a two goal lead. Two

short corners which Khalsa converted to draw level shortly after the half time restart could have derailed plans, but Anna Hawkins found the winner for a 3-2 finish.

MASTERS

On 12 April 2026, the Masters slotted 3 past Hockey Kakis who were unable to secure their "guest" players for this Liga fixture. Goal from skipper Dave Ahier, Siva Subramaniam, and Wayne Blazejczyk saw us running out 3-1 winners, and capping off 4 wins out of 4.

The following week saw the Masters make it 5 wins from 5 games, with a 4-0 routing of the Lion City Stokers. Goals from Wayne Blazejczyk, Jody Aldridge, Caleb Woo and Siva Subramaniam placed us in good stead in our march to the title.

In the first of a double header, the team faced Team HI, and we got an early goal through Matt Hooker. However, as key players from the opponents showed up after pushback, they grew into the game and scored twice after the break, handing us our first loss of the season.

The second game of the double header saw the team make amends with a 2-0 win over Barkerites. Goals from James Buchanan and Jeya Putra Pancharatnam kept us within touching distance of the league leaders.

On 17 May 2026, the team fell to a 1-0 defeat to Orient, with the bright spot being goalkeeper Darren Foo keeping their penalty stroke out.

The team sought to undo the last result with Orient, where we lost 1-0. Hamish Clark found the back of the net early on, but Orient kept the pressure on, and found an equaliser when we failed to clear our lines following a short corner, leaving both teams to share the points that day.

A sign of many bright futures to come representing the black and gold.

A special mention goes to longtime talisman and outgoing captain, Gabriel Lee, who will be hanging up his boots after 23 years of representing the club. A legend of the Section and a man you will never hear a bad word about.

The Premiership final was in its traditional slot occupying the 5pm kickoff. The Prems were up against the old foe against whom each final since Covid-19 has been contested, The Bucks. Coming into the finale, the teams were honors even through two tight games, both won by less than a score.

Having endured a significantly below par opening half to the season, the Prems managed to hit the reset button and find some fine form in the closing rounds, culminating in a dispatching of a Saints team fancied in the early stages of the season. With Eddie

With National League in full swing, the Academy now launched, and an international tour to the Philippines on the horizon, SCC Netball looks forward to an exciting second half of 2026.

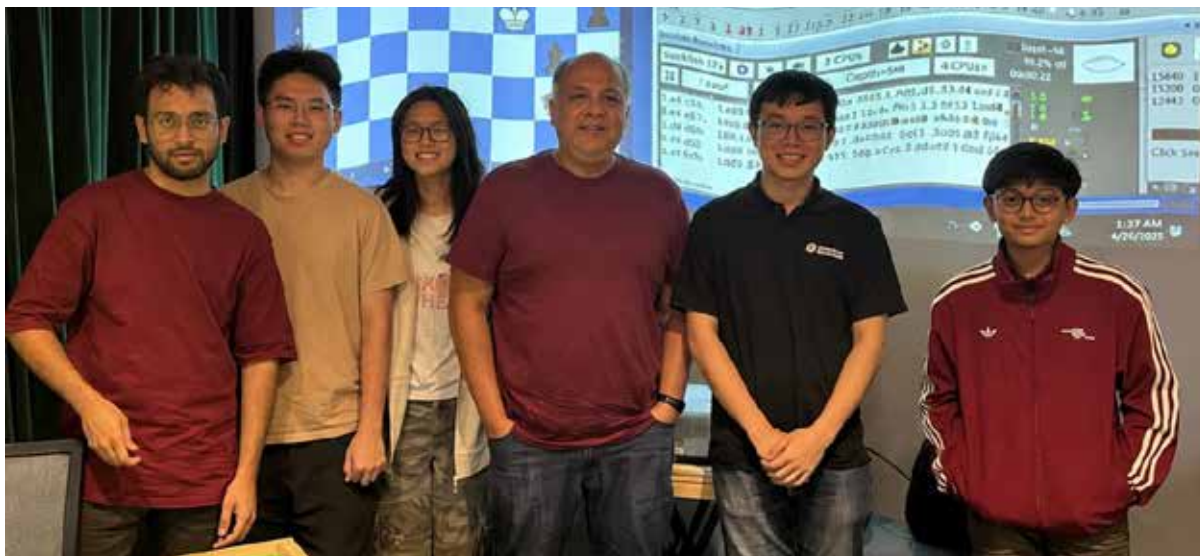

Round 2 featured a crucial match against JPM. Following an impressive opening-week victory over Bishan Chess Club, SCC entered the encounter knowing that another strong result would keep the team firmly in the title race. In a closely fought contest, both sides battled hard across all eight boards, with neither team able to gain a decisive advantage. The match ended in a 4-4 draw, leaving SCC joint top of the league table heading into the final round.

While the outcome was disappointing after coming so close to victory, the team can be proud of an excellent campaign. SCC remained in contention for the title until the very last game of the tournament, demonstrating great commitment, resilience, and fighting spirit throughout the competition. Congratulations to all players who represented the club and contributed to the first ever inter-club chess competition, with a big shout out to Chess Section Committee Member and Events Co-ordinator Sudeep Sarma for enabling this to happen.

On the digital side, the online tournament series has reached the halfway mark, and the race for the top eight qualifying spots for the end-of-year finale is heating up. With several rounds still to play, every point is becoming increasingly valuable as players battle for a place in the season-ending play-offs.

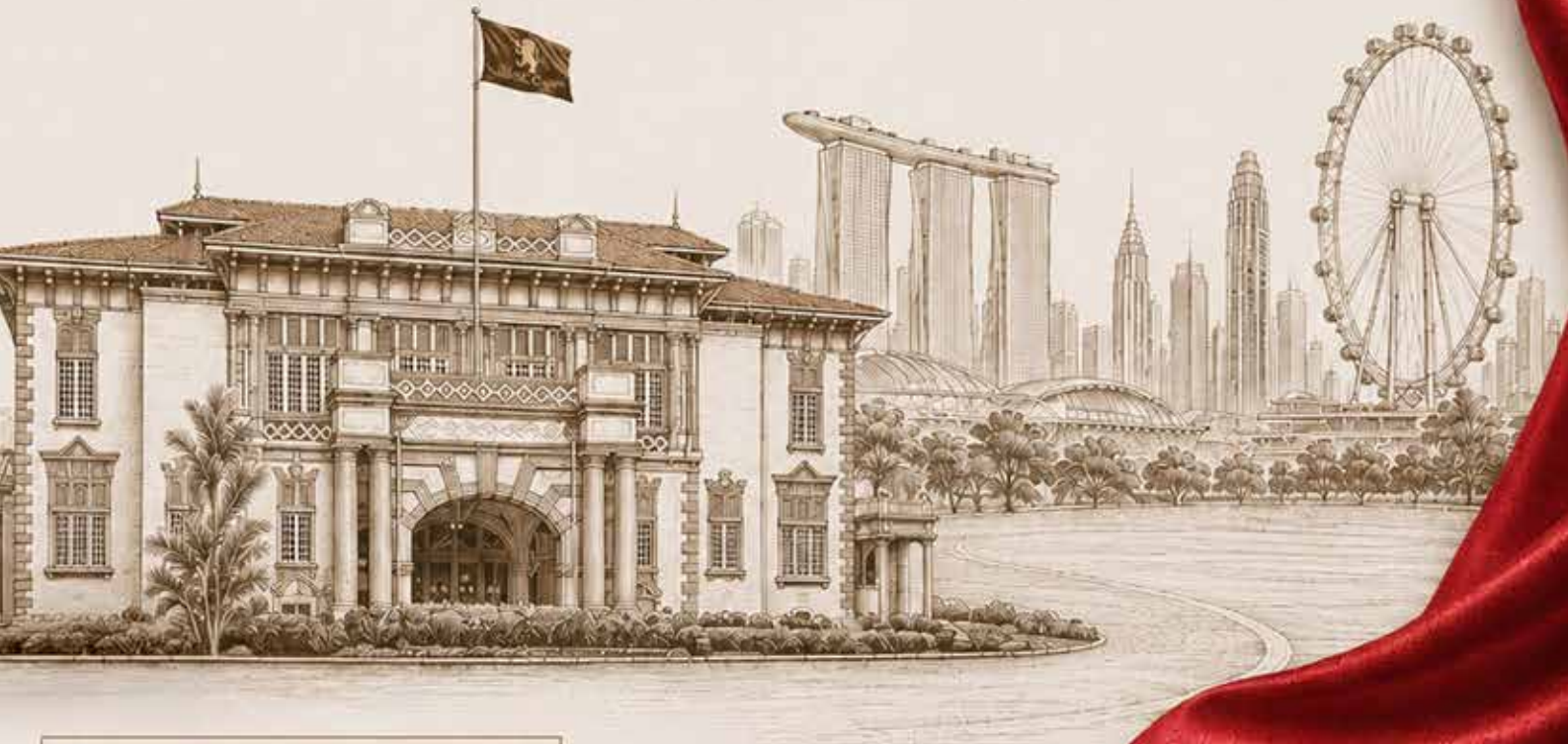
