PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear Members,

It has been another eventful period at the Singapore Cricket Club, with plenty to celebrate across our sporting Sections, our Clubhouse and the wider SCC community.

Our sporting achievements, our *raison d'être*, remain to be a great source of pride. A particular highlight was the Padang Shield 2026, where Team SCC emerged overall winners against our neighbours and friends from the Singapore Recreation Club. I am especially proud that SCC won all six competing sports: Golf, Snooker, Balut, Bridge, Tennis and Football. This was a tremendous result and a wonderful reflection of the talent, commitment and team spirit across our Sections.

We also celebrated another milestone with the inaugural SCC Padang 6s Tournament, held on 1 and 2 August. It was wonderful to see the Padang once again come alive with competitive sport and camaraderie, and I congratulate all the winners, participating teams, organisers and volunteers who contributed to making the first edition a success.

The development and growth of our sporting academies is equally encouraging. In this issue, we welcome the official launch of the SCC Netball Academy, adding another important pathway for young athletes to develop their skills, confidence and love for sport. Together with the progress being made by our other academies, these programmes reinforce SCC's commitment to nurturing the next generation and building a strong sporting legacy for the future.

We were pleased to welcome the latest group of new Members at our recent New Members' Introduction Nights, and I hope they will quickly make SCC a part of their social and sporting lives. I also extend a warm welcome to S Sundaram, our new Head of Property & Housekeeping, and Adrian Yong Tik Loon, our new Head of Marketing Communications & Sponsorship. At the same time, we thank Judy Ting and Trina Tan for their many years of dedicated service to the Club and wish them all the very best in their next chapters.

Our staff are at the heart of the SCC experience, and it was wonderful to see colleagues from across the Club come together at our annual SCC Staff Party, this year themed 'SCC World Cup'. I would also like to congratulate our Long Service Award recipients and thank them for their loyalty, commitment and contributions over the years.

On the financial front, the Club's year-to-date performance as of 31 July 2026 has shown encouraging progress. Revenue was 8.6% higher than in the same period last year, while the key cost remained well controlled.

Overall, the Club's year-to-date net loss as of July was approximately 10% better than budget and 12% better than last year.

While these results are encouraging, there remain areas requiring closer attention.

Sports expenditure is more than 10% above budget, reflecting growing demand for sports support, services and events, while depreciation will be significantly higher following the completion of recent capital projects at Dempsey and the Courtyard. Our focus for the remainder of the year will be on strengthening revenue, maintaining cost discipline, improving beverage margins and managing sports expenditure prudently.

In response to rising operating costs, we have also adjusted our food and beverage pricing. These changes reflect sustained increases in ingredient, manpower, utility and other operating costs. We remain committed to providing Members with a diverse range of dining options while maintaining the quality, service and value expected at SCC, and we sincerely appreciate your understanding and continued patronage.

There is also much to look forward to in the weeks ahead. Our Clubhouse offers a varied calendar of dining experiences, live entertainment and Member activities, while October promises to be particularly lively with SCC Oktoberfest on 3 October, followed by the SCC Night Race from 9 to 11 October. I encourage Members to join us and enjoy these occasions with family and friends.

As always, none of these achievements and activities would be possible without the dedication of our General Committee, Subcommittees, Section Committees, management, staff, coaches and volunteers. My sincere thanks to everyone who gives so generously of their time and energy to the Club.

Most importantly, thank you to our Members for your support, enthusiasm and participation. It is your involvement, whether on the field, at our events, in our dining outlets or simply enjoying the company of fellow Members, that keeps the SCC spirit strong.

I look forward to seeing you at the many activities ahead.

Since the end of June, the Academy has been enjoying a well-earned summer break. Our players have been sharing photos of their rugby adventures around the world, proving rugby truly is a global game. It's great to see our players representing the SCC Rugby Academy wherever they go.

The SCC Rugby Academy's recent jersey swap has helped make a difference far beyond Singapore. More than 250 donated Academy jerseys were delivered to children supported by REACH Siem Reap, a charity tackling poverty in Cambodia. Alongside English lessons, daily rugby and sports sessions gave children the opportunity to proudly wear their own black and gold kit while helping introduce the game in their local community.

Several Academy U17 players stepped up to represent the SCC U19 alongside some of their Academy alumni in July. SCC U19 produced a dominant 62-0 win over Bedok before showing outstanding resilience to come from behind and defeat Oldham 27-23. The teamwork on display across both matches was outstanding.

The Academy acts as a key pipeline for club talent, attracting five new Junior Sports Members—including a Davis Cup player—and converting families into full SCC members.

COMPETITION & COMMUNITY EVENTS

We re-established SCC’s national junior presence with an all-member U14A team in the JTTL team competition, launched a 35-player (so far) TennisRungs ladder, and hosted sold-out events like the Junior Intercup and Roland Garros Dash together with the Tennis Section team.

A FITTING FIRST: THE INAUGURAL ANWARUL HAQUE CUP 2026

There could have been no more fitting stage than the Padang, and no more fitting name for this fixture, than that of Mr. Anwarul Haque.

When the Law Society Masters football team walked out to face the SCC Legends in the inaugural Anwarul Haque Cup, we were not simply playing a match — we were paying tribute to a man who embodied everything this Club, and our profession, aspires to be. Mr Haque was, in every sense, one of our own: a law graduate who went on to serve as a magistrate, a district judge and Deputy Director of the Legal Aid Bureau, yet whose true love for sport never left him, on or off the field.

As an Olympian goalkeeper who represented Singapore at the Asian Games and the combined Malaya team at the 1964 Tokyo Olympics, he brought the same discipline and courage to his sporting life as he did to the law. As SCC President from 2001 to 2008 — following years as Deputy President and committee chairman — he helped shape this Club into a more inclusive, forward-looking institution, championing the extension of voting rights and access to women members well ahead of his time. Few men have served both bar and Padang with such distinction.

To captain a Law Society side against the SCC Legends, under a trophy bearing his name, was a genuine privilege. Every tackle, every run, every moment of hard-fought sportsmanship on the pitch that day was played in the spirit Mr Haque exemplified: fierce competitiveness paired with unfailing grace. Win or lose, that is the standard he set for us.

On behalf of the Law Society Masters team, our gratitude to SCC for agreeing to such a fixture that will keep his memory — and his values — alive on the Padang for generations of lawyers and sportsmen to come.

Rest in peace, Mr Haque. The game goes on, played the way you taught us to play it.

The U17 girls were decimated by injuries to two of their players following the Women's open and then playing the entire tournament with just 5 players, they saw their stand-in goalkeeper leave due to other commitments as the event ran beyond schedule. So our brave U17 Girls played on with just 4, overcoming their quarterfinals 4-1 and then the Semi-Finals 5-1 before winning the finals 3-2. It's noteworthy not only were our Girls down one player from the start, they conceded first in all three of their games.

Meanwhile on the senior side of things, our Ladies Masters did not disappoint again as they retained their O35 title and are the only winners of this competition since its inception. But our Premier and Open women featuring 3 teams of our members could not follow suit. We lost the Premier Final and just missed out on a medal in the Women's Open.

However our Premier Men regained the crown they last won in 2024 with a fine display in the final ousting the defending champions 4-3. Klaas Heerema was in inspired form in our goal and Jonny Verity continued his scoring spree in this small-sided code of hockey too. Ping and our girls were not done and we then beat the next best team also 1-0, also from a Ping goal, a deft deflection this time around following exceptional passing between Petrina de Souza, Janice Tan, Nanthini Thirumoorthi and Abigail Rhodes, who threaded a pass to the often well placed Ping to weave her magic and pulled the challenge trophy out of the magician's hat.

This Austrian Wine Fair was held at the Padang Restaurant and Gilmour Room. Instead of the usual sit-down wine dinner, various Austrian wine exhibitors presented 22 white wines from years 2018 to 2025, and 20 red wines from years 2018 to 2024, at their wine booths. These wines could be paired with different food menu items at 4 live-food stations representing Singapore's diverse food scene, namely Chinese, Malay Indian, and Western. Conversation started in polite and hushed tones on which wine white or red wine went best with which food item. As members and guests imbibed more wine and indulged in more food, conversation became livelier with more definitive views expressed, for example on which Gruner Veltliner (white wine) paired best with which food item. The 'red wine lobby' contributed volubly too, on their choice of best pairing, eg which Blaufrankisch matched best with which Western, Indian, Malay or Chinese food dish. The delightful evening ended with all who attended having had a lovely time, with many thanks to the Austrian Embassy! Members loved the new format and enjoyed the vibes and conversations in an informal setting, walking around and using the opportunity to connect with members.

A former Convenor Section Convenor and club stalwart best described it by saying "I can now confidently say that SCC is the best club in Singapore and perhaps Asia which has a knowledgeable and discerning wine circle, a place that wineries and professionals like to come to."

MARGARET RIVER WINE MASTERCLASS – 14 JULY 2026

This wonderful event followed a successful SCC Wine Circle Margaret River Tour in March 2026. The Wine Masterclass on 14 July at the Padang Restaurant featured white and red wines, introduced and explained by Evan Gill, Vasse Feix Group Sommelier. The 5 selected wines were Idee Fixe Premier Brut Blanc de Blancs 2023, Vasse Felix Filius Chardonnay 2025, Vasse Felix Chardonnay 2024, Vasse Felix Filius Cabernet Sauvignon 2023 and Vasse Felix Cabernet Sauvignon 2022. A handy Wine and Cheese Pairing Guide provided each diner with suggested pairing of these wines with either of the Bleu d'Auvergne, Comte du Jura or 6-Month Aged Manchego Reserva cheeses. The Wine Dinner included a set 3-course dinner, with choices of starter, main course and dessert, with accompanying fruits and nuts. Perhaps another wine tour to the Margaret River area, south of Perth in Australia, is warranted in late 2027.

WINE CIRCLE COMMITTEE – ADDITIONAL MEMBERS

In addition to the existing Wine Committee Members returned unopposed at the AGM on 16 May 2026, 2 more Committee Members, namely Tushar P Doshi and Edith Somogyi, have been co-opted into the WC Committee.
