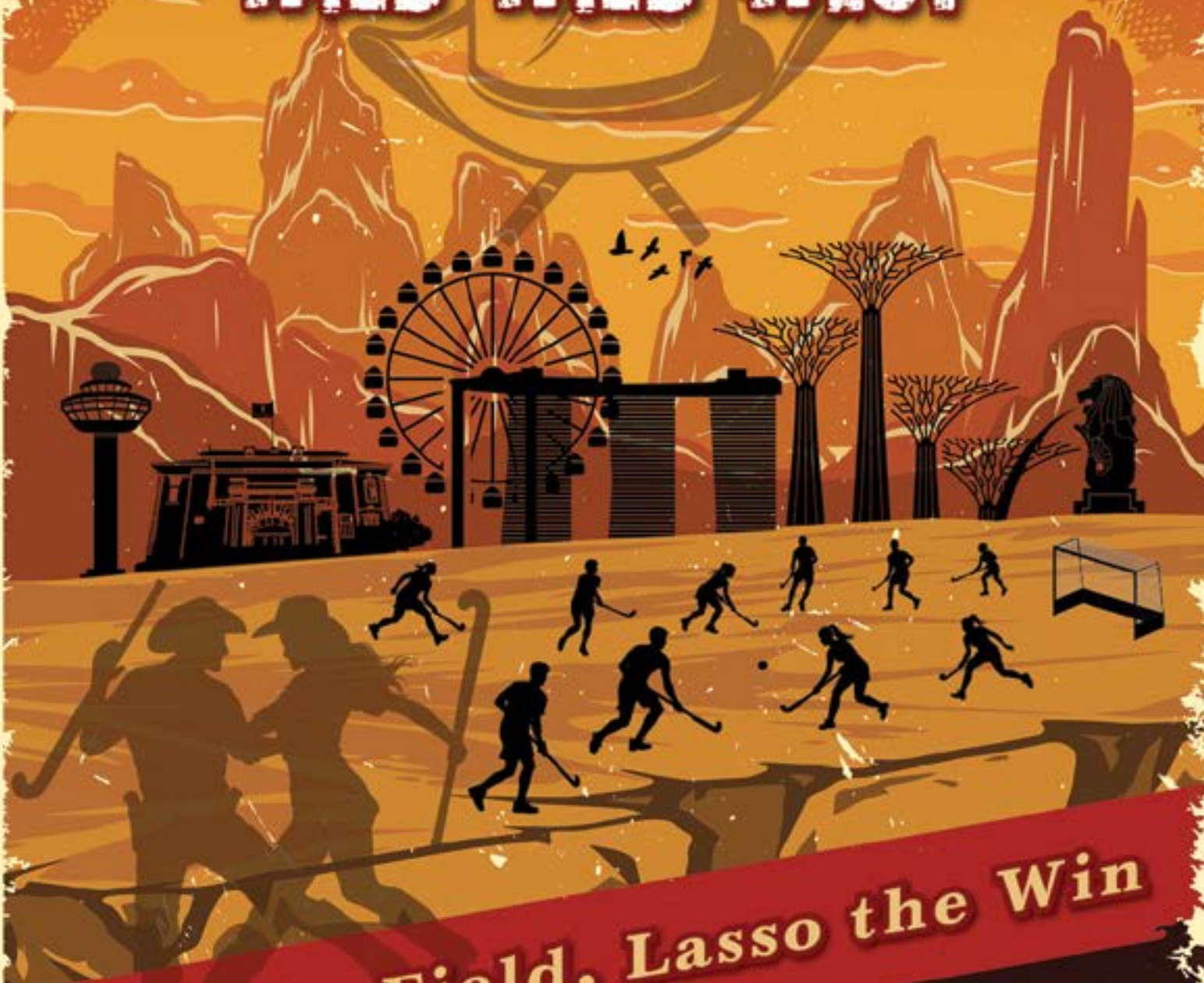

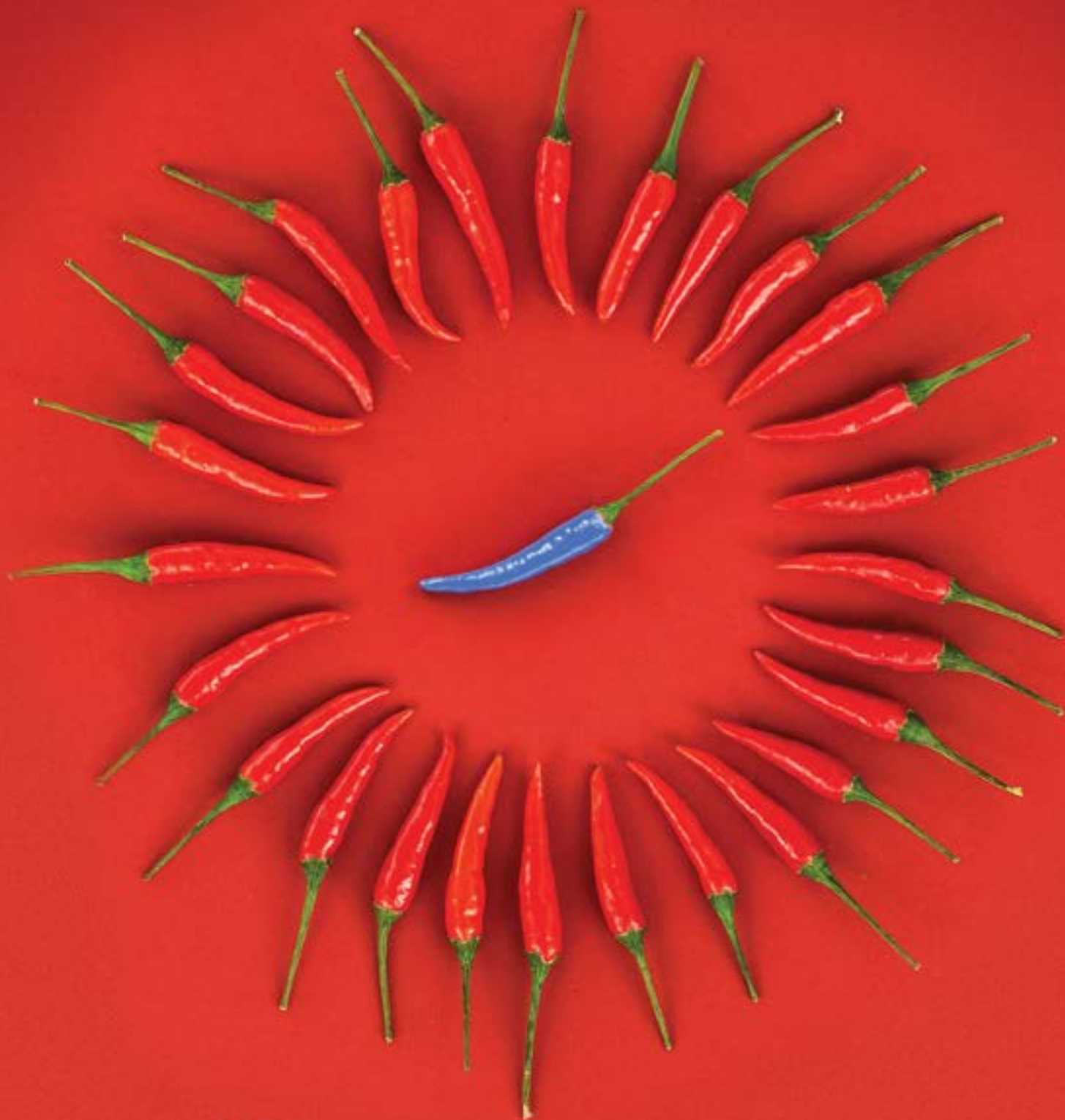

ANWARUL HAQUE CHALLENGE CUP

From this year 2026, the SCC Hockey Sixes - Men's Cup will be named **The Anwarul Haque Challenge Cup**, after former SCC president Mr. Anwarul Haque, who passed away in June 2025.

A long-time SCC member of 56 years, Mr. Haque served SCC as Deputy President from 1995-2000, Chairman of the Development Sub-Committee from 2000-01 and as President from 2001-08.

He was also well known in the Singapore hockey community, representing Singapore as the national goalkeeper at the 1962 & 1970 Asian Games, 1971 SEAP Games and the combined Malaysia team at the 1964 Tokyo Olympics.

Mr. Haque was later President of the Singapore Hockey Federation from 1985 - 1992.

By naming the Men's Cup after Mr. Haque, we honour his exceptional service to SCC, his sportsmanship and legacy, and hope every winning Men's team from hereon exudes his spirit of excellence towards our beloved sport of Hockey.

The Dirty Reds Ride Again!





Tender on the inside but tough on the outside. With a touch of spice, she is sure to bring the heat and a whole lot of flare.



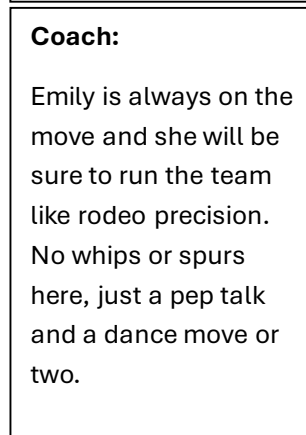

Jason Gabriel (Taurus, favourite colour Magenta) contributes veteran composure and extensive WA Premier League experience. 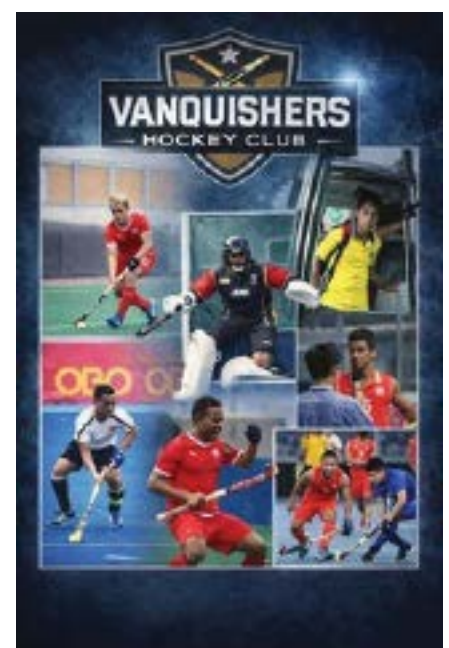
Vanquishers Hockey Club (Singapore)
