PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear Members,

We've had a busy auspicious start to the new year with the completion of two much-anticipated projects: the SCC Dempsey Clubhouse and The Courtyard.

On Saturday, 14 February 2026, Mr Edwin Tong - Minister for Law and Second Minister for Home Affairs - graced the official opening ceremony of the SCC Dempsey Clubhouse and led the ribbon cutting ceremony. He also unveiled the commemorative plaque, marking a new chapter for our newest sports facility that will enable SCC to further support the development of sporting talent not just for our Club, but also for the Singapore sporting community. A more detailed report is in this issue (pages 8 - 9).

A week later, having received the good news that the Temporary Occupation Permit (TPOP) for The Courtyard had finally been granted, we also officially opened The Courtyard with a ribbon cutting ceremony. The tables and chairs were almost immediately taken up by members after the ceremony, and we've seen the space filled out almost every evening since.

On behalf of the General Committee, I would like to extend my gratitude to the Dempsey Taskforce and Property Subcommittee for volunteering their time, and for passionately seeing these projects through to completion.

Next on our to-do list is the refurbishment of the Main Lounge in end-March for approximately 1.5 weeks. The Main Lounge is the heart of our Clubhouse and we believe a face-lift is due for a new refreshing look and feel, while also allowing us to maximise the space to better provide members with enhanced service offerings. Rest assured that this project has been planned such that we will complete it in as short a time as possible to minimize any disruptions to members and guests. Thank you for your patience during this period.

Our Sports Sections have also started the year out well, with many already hard at training and competing in local leagues. Congratulations to our hockey junior girls: Champions of the National Junior League 2026 - Girls League 1 division!

We successfully concluded the 29th SCC International Hockey6s Tournament in the beginning of February, with many of the overseas visiting teams complimenting the excellent quality of our playing pitches on the Padang and the warm hospitality offered by our staff.

Next up on the calendar is the 32nd SCC International Soccer7s Tournament happening on 27 - 29 March 2026. We are expecting 82 teams across seven categories: Open, Masters, Veterans O50s, Legends O60s, Women's, Youth (U12) and Corporate. The guest marquee player for this year's edition is Liverpool legend John Arne Riise - he will be conducting a youth football clinic, having a Q&A session during the tournament gala dinner, interacting with fans on the Padang, and showing off some moves in an exhibition match on Sunday, 29 March. Be sure to come on down during the Soccer7s weekend and join us!

On 25 April, we will honour the SCC members who attained sporting achievements over the past year as well as those who were actively involved in and who contributed to their respective sports sections and the Club at the 16th SCC Sports Awards. This prestigious evening will be one of great celebration as we honour sporting dedication, sportsmanship and camaraderie and I look forward to seeing everyone then.

The month of April will conclude with the SCC Annual General Meeting (AGM) 2025 on 28 April. The Club can only survive when its members are involved so this is an important event which members should participate.

Please note that as part of our transition to more sustainable business practices, the AGM notices and related documents, and the Annual Report will be in digital format only and disseminated via email; so do keep a close eye on your inboxes.

This also marks the end of my last term as Club President. I would like to thank all my fellow General Committee members for collaborating closely with me during my three terms; the Subcommittees and Section Committees for their strong support of the GC's initiatives; and all members for their support.

OFFICIAL OPENING OF SCC DEMPSEY CLUBHOUSE

On Saturday, 14 February 2026, the SCC Dempsey Clubhouse was officially opened by Guest of Honour Mr. Edwin Tong, Minister for Law and Second Minister for Home Affairs.

With a ribbon cutting ceremony, the unveiling of the commemorative plaque and a lion dance performance to usher in good luck, we marked a new chapter for SCC Dempsey - which is a manifestation of the Club's commitment to invest in sport not just for its members but for the wider sporting community in Singapore.

SCC President Mathavan Devadas opened the ceremony with his welcome address and said, "SCC prides itself on being a premier sports club, and this facility builds on that commitment. We spent over S\$6.5 million in maintaining and developing (SCC Dempsey) because we love sports. Not just for members. It's about sports for all."

He was followed by Rules & Membership Chairman and Dempsey Taskforce Chairman Mr Sam Sharpe who explained the extent of the SCC Dempsey redevelopment project which features a new multi-purpose court with a full-size competition netball and tennis court, enhanced changing rooms, and a food and beverage outlet. Dual-use rugby and football pitches have also been re-turfed with professional-grade zoysia grass, with similar works underway for the cricket field.

In his address to the audience - the GC, past Presidents, members of the Dempsey Taskforce, and representatives of our Sections - Mr Tong noted that the redevelopment reflects the Club's strong sporting tradition and the importance of broad access to facilities: "If you let a thousand flowers bloom, you let as many play as possible, you let there be facilities, training, infrastructure, programmes, great coaches, then one day you will be able to see that talent pipeline strengthen."

Mr Tong also highlighted the collaboration between the club and government agencies, including the SLA, Sport Singapore and the Urban Redevelopment Authority.

Following the official opening ceremony, Mr Tong toured the SCC Dempsey facilities and interacted with SCC Sports Sections and Sports Academies who were holding training sessions and games on our courts and fields.

We appreciate Minister Tong making the time to celebrate this Club milestone with us, thank everyone who helped bring this project to fruition, and appreciate all our members' support.

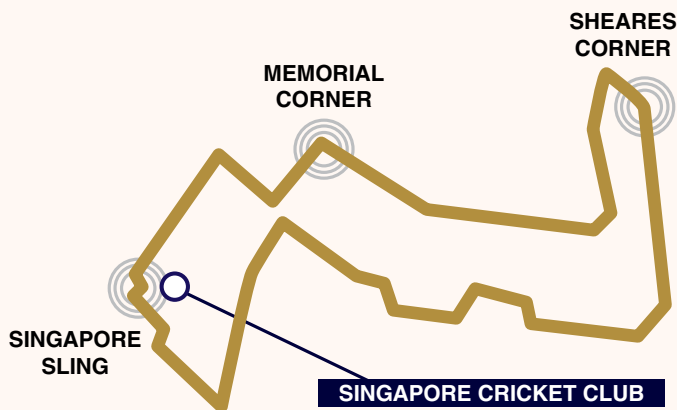

Remembering Mr. Hamish Alexander Christie (1948 – 2026)

Life Member, Singapore Cricket Club



Eulogy reproduced with permission from SCC Deputy President Martin Goerojo:

I speak today on behalf of the Singapore Cricket Club in remembrance of our dear fellow member, Hamish Christie. As a Deputy President, I had the privilege of working closely with Hamish, and it is on behalf of the Club that I wish to share a few reflections on his time and his contribution to our Club.

Hamish joined the Singapore Cricket Club shortly after arriving to Singapore nearly five decades ago, in 1978. Since those early days, SCC has become a central part of his life and over the years he developed a strong affection for the Club not only as a sporting institution but as a place rooted in tradition, camaraderie and mutual respect.

Hamish gave generously of his time and expertise to the governance of the Club. He served on General Committees since 1997, holding key roles including as the Finance Member and the Chair of the Human Resources Subcommittee. In these capacities, he was known for his sound judgment, financial prudence and sound decision making.

While Hamish was never one to seek the spotlight, his influence was widely felt. He cared deeply about the long-term health of the Club as well as the well-being of the staff. He worked tirelessly to ensure that SCC remained well governed, financially secure and true to its traditions. For his efforts, he was recognized by the fellow members as a Life Member in 2024.

Most of us will remember him just as much for his quiet moments as for his years of dedicated service to the Club. A member of the Balut Section and Wine Circle, he had a particular fondness for a glass of white wine, best enjoyed at the corner of the bar at the Main Lounge. He took genuine pleasure in watching members play their sports just outside of the Oval Verandah.

Above all, Hamish will be remembered as a gentleman of integrity, generosity and loyalty - someone who embodied the spirit of Singapore Cricket Club. His many years of service will leave a lasting legacy and he will be remembered by fellow members, subcommittee colleagues and friends.

The Singapore Cricket Club owes him a debt of gratitude. A true Clubman who will be greatly missed.

MAHJONG COMPETITION RULES (MCR)

There is a growing buzz among our members around a different and exciting format of play known as Mahjong Competition Rules (MCR). For players looking for fresh challenges and a different kind of thinking game, MCR offers a refreshing change.

SO, WHAT IS MCR?

MCR is an internationally recognised format of mahjong played with 144 tiles. To win, a player needs to score at least eight points, choosing from many possible winning patterns. Compared to other styles, MCR places more focus on planning and decision-making, rather than speed or luck.

This is quite different from our familiar Singapore Mahjong, which uses 148 tiles and often rewards quick wins and high scores. Both formats are enjoyable in their own way—they simply offer different playing experiences.

In January, we organised a trial MCR table with four players, supported by an invited coach. The response was very encouraging. Participants enjoyed learning a new style of play and appreciated the guidance provided. Building on this positive feedback, we will be holding more trial sessions in February and March, again with the help of our coach, who has kindly agreed to continue supporting our members.

If you are curious about learning something new or improving your overall mahjong skills, these sessions are a great place to start.

RANDOM SEATING

Last year, we introduced random seating to encourage members to play with different partners. This initiative was very well received. Players enjoyed meeting new opponents, experiencing different playing styles, and keeping each game interesting.

Due to its success, we held a random seating in January and it will now continue once every three months, giving everyone the chance to learn from one another and enjoy a fresh game experience.
