Singapore National Day Parade (NDP) 2023 Road Closures | Designated Pedestrian Access

Due to the NDP 2023 rehearsals, preview shows and actual day celebrations, all vehicular roads leading to and from SCC will be closed on the following days:

> 10 June (Sat) • 2 July (Sun) 22 July (Sat) 17 June (Sat) 8 July (Sat) • 29 July (Sat) 24 June (Sat) • 15 July (Sat) • 9 August (Wed)

- There will be no vehicular access to the SCC Clubhouse from 0200hrs on the above-listed dates, until 0200hrs of the dates following them.
 - Example: no vehicular access from 0200hrs on 10 June until 0200hrs on 11 June
- Vehicles will not be allowed to park and/or be left overnight at the SCC Clubhouse from 2330hrs on the day before the above-listed dates.
 - Example: no vehicles at SCC carpark from 2330hrs on 9 June, for the 10 June rehearsal.
- Any vehicles left at the SCC Clubhouse's carpark will be towed away by the authorities, and the vehicle owner will be solely responsible for the retrieval of his/her vehicle at his/her own cost. Neither the Club nor the authorities may be held responsible for any damage caused to the vehicle.

The Club will continue operating as usual during these dates/ times.

Single Pedestrian Access to SCC Clubhouse:

There will be only one designated foot path access and entry/exit point set by the National Day Parade Organising Committee (NDPOC) which SCC Members, Guests, and Reciprocal club members with proper identification must strictly follow and not deviate from.

- The pedestrian path start-point starts from Cavenagh Bridge (near Fullerton Hotel).
- There is no access from City Hall MRT, North Bridge Road and Esplanade Park.







WHEN DID YOU START PLAYING LAWN BOWLS? WHAT WAS IT ABOUT THE SPORT THAT ATTRACTED YOU?

I started in mid-1989 and was introduced to the sport by my husband TQ Lim. I must share my experience. I was an armchair bowler before even getting on the green. Once fired by my interest, I read extensively and watched the videos on the Jack High series in Australia. I had my friend tape the series in Australia and sent them to me. When I first stepped on the Green, I was supported by this wealth of knowledge and practised what I picked up from the expert players on video. From the very start, I was hooked by the challenges of this precision game.

HOW WOULD YOU DESCRIBE YOUR TIME AT THE SCC AND YOUR ACTIVE INVOLVEMENT IN THE BOWLS SECTION?

My time with SCC Bowls Section has been most fulfilling and active. Over the years it has afforded me the innumerable opportunities to play at top level, to be an organiser and to be a coach to newcomers. In fact, Bowls meant so much to me that I gave up being a principal to continue my involvement in Bowls when I was given the ultimatum - Bowls or School Headship by Director of Education.

WHAT ARE SOME OF YOUR BEST MEMORIES PLAY-ING FOR SCC/ PARTICIPATING IN SECTION ACTIVI-TIES/EVENTS?

I carry with me easily four wonderful decades of Bowls. Every experience is richly etched in my memory. Bowls at the Club has brought me to nearly all over the world in competitions. Friends at home and overseas have made their mark in my life. At the Club I cherish with fondness Bowlers like Rosemary, the Chais, Arnie and Mary Ware and the Koopals John and Jean Childe whom we jokingly refer to as the children.

I have lived through some of the most significant moments in the history of sports. Now with humour I recall the days when I had to wear a skirt that was one foot from the ground. In those days they would have been appalled by the becoming shorts worn by Shermeen and Kelvyna today. Outfits were white or grey, none of the colourful polo shirts we wear today.

The many celebrative events to commemorate festivals like Deepavali, Christmas and end of year carnivals deserve mention for the camaraderie and festive mood sealed with the delicious spread from SCC kitchen to whet our appetites. Thank goodness we have photos to keep memories alive.

UK Estate Planning

& reducing your Inheritance Tax (IHT) exposure



Whether you are British, have a UK domicile of origin (i.e. your father was British) or you hold property or other assets in the UK, there is a good chance that all, or at least some of your assets will be liable to 40% tax on your death. We discuss ways in this article how you can protect the value of your estate for future generations.

If you've spent your life working hard to build up assets, you'll no doubt want to protect them for the benefit of your family. If you haven't considered your potential UK Inheritance Tax bill for the future, now might be the time to start thinking about Inheritance Tax planning. IHT is currently charged at a rate of 40% on the value of your estate over £325,000. The IHT receipts that HMRC receives has been steadily increasing each year which means that more families are increasingly being brought within the IHT net. Even if you are not British, as long as you have assets situated in the UK such as properties for example, these will also be subject to UK IHT. Fortunately, there are plenty of planning opportunities to lessen the burden on your family whilst ensuring that your assets are passed on according to your wishes.

There are a number of different ways to reduce your IHT bill, and these can include things like utilising your IHT allowances and giving away gifts to your family, insuring your IHT liability, utilising trusts, and having a valid Will.

A more complex but very effective route to managing your UK estate tax liability includes establishing an appropriate overseas pension scheme (which must be recognised by HMRC) and the use of Family Investment Companies have become increasingly popular with high net worth families as they do not have some of the same restrictions including lifetime limits that apply to trusts.

For mixed-domicile families (where only one spouse is UK-Dom), the use of excluded property trusts can be a highly effective planning tool, offering a permanent shelter to UK IHT even if a non-UK Domicile settlor becomes UK-Domicile in the future.

That all said, gifting your assets away remains the most straightforward way to reduce your IHT bill. You can give away up to £3,000 each tax year (your 'annual exemption'), as well as make any number of small gifts up to £250 per person. These won't then be counted in the final tally of your estate. Almost all gifts, however large, become IHT exempt if you survive for seven years. If you do not wish to gift your assets away now, you may want to consider the use of proper trust planning which can ensure that your assets are being left to your loved ones in the best way possible whilst allowing you to retain some degree of control and flexibility.

Having a Will in place also ensures that your estate is distributed in line with your wishes and that your loved ones rightfully inherit your legacy. If you don't create a Will, your assets will be distributed according to the laws of intestacy, which could lead to your assets ending up in the hands of those that you do not wish to benefit from. It is also important to review your Will every now and then to make sure that it is up to date. If you have assets across different jurisdictions, make sure that your overseas assets are dealt with properly through the use of appropriate Wills, so that they reach the people you intend to benefit.


