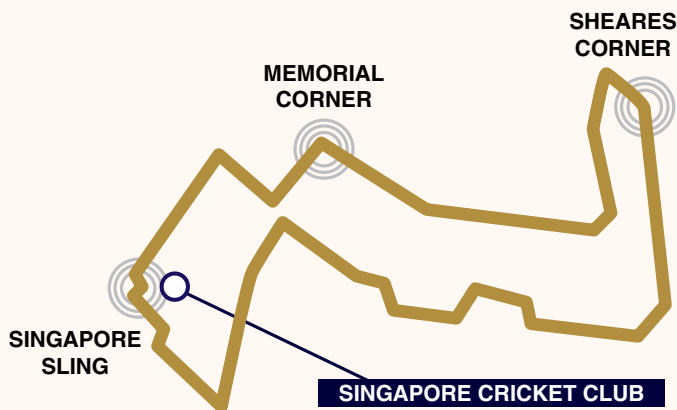

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear Members,

Thank you for your active participation in our Club's Annual General Meeting on 28 April 2025. I am pleased to share that the majority of members approved all four proposed resolutions, reflecting our collective commitment to the Club's continued growth and success.

On behalf of the Club, I extend my sincere appreciation to Mr. Mathavan Devadas (President), Mr. James Blythman (Finance Member), Mr. Samuel Sharpe (Chairman of Rules & Membership Subcommittee) and Ms. Joanna Ossinger (Chairperson of Marketing & Communications Subcommittee) for their dedicated service and contributions to the Club. We also remember Mr. Hamish Christie, and the many years of service to the Club in many General Committees; he will be dearly missed.

We warmly welcome Mr. David Yim, who joins the new General Committee as Finance Member, along with Ms. Nathalie Danks, Mr. Rodd Harrison, Mr. Vijay Sirse and Mr. Alan Wee. We look forward to their fresh perspectives and contributions alongside the re-elected GC Members.

Most recently, the Club hosted one of its marquee events – the 32nd SCC International Soccer7s Tournament 2026. Nearly 80 teams from across the region competed in seven categories: Open, Masters, Veterans o50s, Legends o60s, Women's, Youth and Corporate. We were honoured to welcome Liverpool legend John Arne Riise, who shared his stories in an intimate Q&A session at the pre-tournament gala dinner. The evening also featured Malaysia cup winners Leong Kok Fann (1980) Fandi Ahmad, Abbas Saad, Steven Tan (all 1994), Jita Singh (coach of the 1994 team), and AFF Suzuki Cup winner Alex Duric (2012). During the tournament weekend, John Arne Riise led a kids' soccer clinic, hosted meet-and-greet fan sessions, and showcased his formidable left foot skills.

On the final day of the tournament, our U12 SCC Football Academy triumphed in the Youth category. Other highlights included two exhibition matches: SCC Legends vs FCOB (Football Coaches Old Boys), founded by former national and NFL footballers from the early 80's and 90's, SCC Celebrity All Stars vs SCC Soccer 7s All Stars. The latter featured Mr. Edwin Tong (Minister for Law and Second Minister for Home Affairs), Mr. Alvin Tan (Minister of State for Ministry of National Development and Ministry of Trade and Industry) and Mr. Jeffrey Siow (Acting Minister for Transport and Senior Minister of State for Finance), and several ex-Singapore Internationals. The star-studded line-up was truly a testament to the prestige of our Soccer7s tournament.

At the 16th SCC Sports Awards held on Saturday, 25 April, the Club celebrated the achievements of our athletes, teams, and Sports Sections. Mr. Bala Chandran s/o A. Kandiah received the Lifetime Achievement Award 2026 for his outstanding contributions to the Hockey and Football Sections, and for his immense contributions to Singapore's wider sporting community.

Looking ahead, the closed tender process for our VIP Hospitality Suites at the SCC Night Race 2026 will take place in the month of May 2026. These exclusive venues within our Clubhouse premises offer prime vantage points to experience the Singapore Grand Prix up close and are ideal for corporate entertaining. Ticket sales for SCC Night Race 2026 to members will follow in June.

The calendar of social events is equally vibrant in the months ahead, so do check them out and sign up early. The Padang Restaurant will host brunch buffets for Mother's Day and Father's Day, specially curated by our culinary teams.

Our Sports and Activities Sections continue to thrive, with training, meet-ups, and overseas tours. Notably, our Squash JSMs Kareena Sashikumar and Jackrish Sashikumar excelled at the International Junior Squash Championships 2026, winning gold and bronze respectively. At the ONCOCARE National Junior Championships 2026, our Squash JSMs secured 13 medals, including five golds, across U13-U10 Girls and Boys categories. In Bowls, Harriman Yuen and Christian Huang were champion and joint-bronze medalists respectively in the Bowls National Singles – 21 Shots Up. Our SCC Tennis Ladies B1 team conquered the Ladies B category in the final of the STA Inter-Club Singles League 2026, making SCC the champion and the first runner-up.

If you have yet to join a Section, I strongly encourage you to do so. It is the best way to get to know fellow members and immerse yourself in the unique Club lifestyle that SCC offers in the very heart of the city.

Annual General Meeting

28 April 2026

The Annual General Meeting (AGM) of the Singapore Cricket Club was conducted on 28 April 2026 at The Padang Restaurant. Chairman Mr. Mathavan Devadas called the meeting to order at 18:33, with voting conducted electronically. With all business of the AGM concluded, the Chairman declared the meeting closed at 21:44.

The Club extends its congratulations to the newly elected Office Bearers at this year's AGM.

Resolution 1

Increase in Subscription Fees

To resolve that in accordance with Rules 45(b) and 45(c) there will be a monthly subscription increase for the following categories of members:-

- (i) Ordinary Members;
- (ii) Term Members;
- (iii) Sports Members;
- (iv) Ordinary (Transferable) Members; and
- (v) Corporate (Transferable) Members (per nominee) and
- (vi) Family Members per head

The monthly subscription increase will take effect as follows:

- From 01 June 2026, monthly subscription will be increased from S\$136 per month to S\$140 per month and family subscription from S\$41 per month to S\$45 per month.

The Resolution is declared carried by majority.

Resolution 2

Rename to Financial Statements in Club Rules

That the current Rule 56(a) and 57(b) be and is hereby amended in the manner set out in the annexure hereto titled "Resolution Two – Proposed Amendments to Rule 56(a) and 57(b)" or in such other manner as this General Meeting may approve in whole or in parts with or without amendments and the General Committee be empowered to compile the amended Rule as approved by this AGM for submission to the Registrar of Societies for sanction. The amendment is intended to more accurately describe the document in question.

The Resolution is declared carried by majority.

Resolution 3

That it shall be made a Club rule that the following historical names shall be preserved and shall not be changed or renamed:

- Singapore Cricket Club;
- Padang Restaurant;
- Gilmour Room;
- Victoria Room;
- The Oval & Verandah;
- Men's Bar;
- The Deli & Courtyard;
- Stumps.

The Resolution is declared carried by majority.

Resolution 4

Whereas:

1. Rules 28 and 31 of the Rules of the Singapore Cricket Club (the "Club Rules") set out the provisions on expulsion and suspension of Members.
2. Any change to Members' rights in relation to expulsion, suspension or similar disciplinary action should only be made with Members' approval through a formal change to the Club Rules.

Now therefore it is resolved that:

1. Any change to the rights of Members in relation to expulsion, suspension, withdrawal of privileges, termination of membership, or other disciplinary action (including the procedures to be followed and any rights of appeal) shall only be made by way of an amendment to the Club Rules in accordance with Rule 61.
2. Such rights shall not be altered by Bye-Laws, policies, guidelines, practices or decision of the Committee or any sub-committee.

If this resolution is passed then the Notice to Amend the Bye-Laws dated 7 April 2026 (subsequently updated to 16 April 2026) shall be considered null and void.

The Resolution is declared carried by majority.

The Club organised the 32nd edition of the SCC International Soccer 7s over 27 – 29 Mar 2026 at the Padang.

It gives me great pride to share that over the past three years, our exceptionally dedicated team has not only continued the tournament's legacy but has elevated it, leaving the SCC Soccer 7s in a stronger position than before.

Our journey has been marked by several key achievements:

- **Pioneering Digital Engagement:** We expanded the tournament's digital reach by building the official Instagram page from scratch, cultivating a community of over 2,000 followers, and generating an impressive 1.3 million views in a single week. Following a busy Term 1 at SCC Rugby Academy, Term 2 is already shaping up to be just as exciting with lots of opportunities for our players.

SCC Rugby Academy has its strongest presence ever in the Junior Rugby Club Singapore (JRCS) League this season with two teams in every age group and three teams in the U11 category. Our aim as an Academy is always to give players the best possible experience and as much game play to as many players as possible. The League, which brings together junior clubs from across Singapore, culminates in finals in early June and provides an excellent opportunity for players to develop their skills, compete and represent the Academy with pride. With weekly home fixtures at Dempsey alongside away matches across the island, the season is already well underway. It has been great to watch our players taking to the pitch with their teammates and support from their families and the wider community. We wish all teams the very best in the weeks ahead.

March also delivered a landmark achievement for the Academy on the international stage. SCC Rugby Academy's U12 squad made history with a remarkable debut victory at the prestigious Sainte Dévôte Rugby Tournament in Monaco. Competing against 24 top youth teams from around the world, the 12-player squad rose to the challenge. Drawn into a competitive pool alongside teams from Argentina, Georgia and hosts Monaco, SCC produced an outstanding opening day, winning all three matches to progress to the knockout stages. They continued their impressive run with a 4-2 win over Barcelona's Gothics in the quarter-finals, before edging the Georgian Barbarians, a national select side, 2-1, in a hard-fought semi-final. Notably, SCC were the only team to score against the Georgians throughout the tournament.

In the final, SCC faced England's Cobham Rugby Club and delivered their most complete performance of the competition, securing a dominant 4-1 victory to be crowned champions. They have become the first team from outside France and South Africa to win the tournament, an extraordinary achievement reflecting the squad's talent, resilience, and unity.



Closer to home, the Academy's girls' programme is going from strength to strength. The girls' contact team showcased impressive resilience and determination at the recent St Patrick's Cup, delivering strong performances across all age groups. It is encouraging to see the continued growth and development of this programme, with increasing participation and confidence on display.

Meanwhile, the girls' touch rugby teams have also been actively involved, hosting a number of friendly matches, providing valuable opportunities for game time, skill development and teamwork in a supportive and enjoyable environment.

Looking ahead there's also plenty to be excited about. Ten SCC Rugby Academy teams will travel to Hong Kong for the HKFC Youth 10s in April, followed by the Saints 7s tournament here in Singapore. With the JRCS league season building towards finals in June, the months ahead promise more opportunities for players to compete, develop, and represent the Academy with pride.

THE SAT XI'S SRI LANKA ADVENTURE

The Singapore Cricket Club's recent tour of Sri Lanka delivered everything a great club tour should: cricket, beach, camaraderie, family time, laughter and just enough chaos to keep everyone honest. What began as one of those classic touring ideas—enthusiastically approved before anyone had quite worked out the details—became one of the most memorable trips the group has shared in years.

Colombo set the tone from the start. There was the now famous journey to the India–Pakistan game on a party bus, complete with a live band and bartenders on board, which meant the tour hit full volume well before the first ball was bowled. It was a rare privilege to watch one of the most politically charged India–Pakistan World Cup fixtures in the comfort of a corporate box, with all the noise and tension of the occasion safely framed by good food, cold drinks and very vocal SCC support. Off the field, the city offered everything a touring party could want: long lunches, lively dinners and the kind of easy hospitality that reminds visitors why Sri Lanka remains such a special place to travel.

The cricket, of course, sat at the heart of the week. Three matches were played on some of Colombo's most spectacular grounds, with the finale against the Veterans of the Singhalese Sports Club at their famous SSC Test ground. The visiting SCC side were privileged to play at a venue dressed for the T20 World Cup, with tournament hoardings and banners still in place. The games gave players their competitive moments, selectors their hindsight, and everyone else the chance to enjoy the familiar rhythm of touring cricket: early starts, exaggerated post match analysis and the occasional performance that improved significantly by dinner.

What made this tour particularly special was that it was not just about the players. Families added a different dimension to the week and made the whole experience warmer, fuller and more memorable. Shared meals, road trips and time together in both Colombo and Galle turned the tour into something far more than a cricket itinerary; it became a genuine travelling community. For the tour's Sri Lankan connections, there was also a deeper note of nostalgia and pride in showing friends a country that combines warmth, humour and character in such generous measure. By the time the tour returned to Colombo for its gala finale, the overwhelming sense was that everyone—members and families alike—had shared something rare: a cricket tour that managed to be spirited, funny and genuinely enriching all at once.

Pulling together a complex multi-faceted event and delivering it so smoothly over the course of the weekend was no easy feat, and great credit must go to the entire team.

The weekend began with a gala dinner and charity auction at The Padang Restaurant, with Guest of Honour, legendary ex-Liverpool and Norwegian international John Arne Riise, gracing the occasion. Thanks to the generosity of Club Members and guests, a significant amount of money was raised to support grassroots football activities at SCC, including the International Soccer 7s.

The categories contested were Open, Women's, Masters, Veterans (Over 50s), Legends (Over 60s), Corporate, and Youth Under 12. Our Football Section entered a total of eight teams across these categories and achieved very respectable results.

In the Open category, SCC Singapore Football League A and B, as well as the Tigers, took part. Both SFL A and SFL B topped their respective groups on Saturday and reached the Cup semi-finals on Sunday. SFL A narrowly lost 2-0 to Singapore Vikings FC, the eventual Cup winners. SFL B were also edged out 2-1 by Royal Bangkok Sports Club, the winners of last year's event. Our SCC Tigers finished third in their group and concluded their campaign in the Plate semi-finals.

In the Women's competition, our SCC Pumas were drawn into a tough group and reached the Plate semi-finals, where they suffered a narrow 3-2 defeat to Braca Vita FC. YFH Phuket was the eventual Cup winners in this category. This was especially pleasing for the Section, as YFH is an organisation and football community that has been supported financially for many years by Members of the SCC Football Section, particularly the Padantiques.

In the Veterans category, our SCC Over 50s had an excellent run on the opening day, topping their group undefeated with three wins and two draws. The team edged out FIS Brickwork Boys in the semi-final before their unbeaten run came to an end in the Cup final against Bruce James' Select, a side stacked with well-known names including Abbas Saad. TANJONG PUTRI: PLANTATION GOLF COURSE IN JOHOR BAHRU - 12 MARCH 2026

The Plantation Course at Tanjong Puteri Golf Resort in Johor Bahru is known for its 18-hole, 6,454-meter layout originally designed by Max Wexler, featuring Zoysia Matrella fairways. The course is renowned for being set within an old oil palm estate, with many oil palm trees still lining the fairways

Fruit Tree Hazards: Holes 4, 6, 7, 14, 15, and 17 feature preserved fruit trees, including durian, mango, jackfruit, and coconut palms.

Undulating Terrain: The course is built on natural undulating terrain, enhanced by flowering shrubs.

Surface: The fairways are turfed with Zoysia Matrella, while the greens are Bermuda Tifdwarf.

The SCC Golf Section Team arrived at the plantation course in time for a quick bite, grabbed some bottles of water and headed to the first Tee Box. Everyone warmed up until it was their turn to tee off. Everyone was jovial and reserved as it was an early start at 6am from the SCC Clubhouse with tea, coffee and biscuits. The Drive is across water and then it's a par 5. While that first shot should have been safe there seemed to be many balls that went in the water, hit a tree or a lighting stand. Racquet grips must be in good condition. Worn-out grips are not allowed, as loose fragments may damage the court flooring. We appreciate Members' cooperation in maintaining these standards and protecting the courts for the enjoyment of all. We look forward to seeing you on court soon!

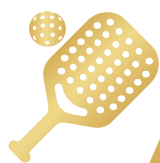

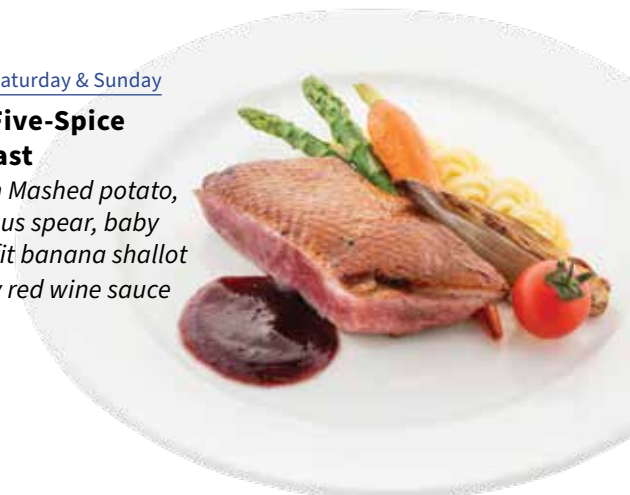
