

In the Clubhouse, we're getting ready for the Christmas festivities and to usher in the new year. We congratulate The Tanglin Club on their win in this year's POT Games. In this day and age, it has become important more than ever for member clubs such as ours to not just maintain but conscientiously build on our long friendship through the various friendlies engaged in by our Sections.

The annual POT Games between the Singapore Cricket Club and Tanglin Club is the culmination of these long years of friendship and partnership. I hope our Sections enjoyed the meaningful exchanges with one another through the friendly matches, and thank our SCC players for flying the SCC flag high with their hard work and sportsmanship.

Most recently on 26 Oct, our SCC Men's Hockey team won the Division 4 title of the Men's Hockey League 4 – well done!

Congratulations also to our SCC SFL team who were crowned champions of the Singapore Football League (SFL) -Division 1 2025.

At the National Singles (Sets) Bowls 2025, Harriman Yuen and Josephine Sarbo both came in joint third in the Men's Singles and Women's Singles respectively.

SCC won the inaugural T20 Cricket Triangular against host Royal Selangor Club and Madras Cricket Club in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia in mid-October. The 14-player SCC squad, led by Lions Captain Arit Dutta, included a mix of senior players and some of SCC's most promising Junior Sports Members, many of whom also represent Singapore's national and U19 teams.

Our Squash Junior players did us proud at the 18th Korea Junior Squash Open 2025, winning the Girls U17 championship, and taking both the second and third places in the Boys U17.

On the re-development front, the work on the Courtyard should be completed by early November. The requisite government approvals for a Temporary Occupation Permit (TOP) will be sought thereafter and is likely to take about eight weeks. We hope to have the Courtyard operational in January 2026. Once again, I thank members for their patience. The Club management are working hard to ensure completion of this project in the best possible time.

At Dempsey, construction of the Multi-Purpose Court has been completed and we are waiting for the necessary government approvals, which will hopefully allow us to use the facility before year end. In addition, construction of the F&B facility and changing rooms is almost complete and we anticipate being able to fully open all the facilities some time in January.

As 2025 comes to an end, I would like to express my gratitude to all our members for their support of all the GC, Subcommittees, Section Committees and staff have done these past months. I wish you and your loved ones a great start to the new year.

SCC BALI MEMORIAL 11 AND 12 OCTOBER 2025

For the SCC Rugby Section and for so many others, the Bali Bombings on 12 October 2002 is remembered as a day of unspeakable pain and loss. 23 years ago, eight of our teammates were among the 202 lives lost in a senseless act of violence. As per tradition, we commemorated and honoured their memory by taking to the field to enjoy the sport they loved, before our annual dawn memorial service.

The commemorative activities began the day before, with the SCC Growlers taking on Wanderers as part of the SRU Vets League. We were joined by our brothers from Gaulois XV, Wanderers and Bucks to pay our respects in a minute of silence. The match itself was a showcase of bravery, physicality and skill (and a few dropped balls), with highlights including the silky stepping of Paddy Flynn for the opening score, and a try by the newly-wed and Growlers debutant Roy Tong. The SCC Growlers ended up winning 41-12, but in the end the day was ultimately a victory for the camaraderie and spirit of rugby.

On the morning of 12 October itself, members of the Section across generations gathered at the club before the break of dawn, with many more tuning in virtually from around the world. Section member Andy Douglas, who was there in Bali on that tragic day, provided some moving words of courage. While we lost eight incredible men far too early that night, he reminded us that it provided something powerful - a bond that time and tragedy would never break, and each year as we come together, we reaffirm that bond.



While the Section has grown and changed over the years, the memory of Bali remains at our core. Every time we go on tour, pull on the jersey, share a beer, or tell one of the old stories, we carry on their legacy and keep their memory alive, knowing that they are with us. Their memory reminds us to live life to the full, and to never take a single day for granted.

Gone but never forgotten. Forever in Rugby.

SCC SFL TEAM CROWNED NATIONAL **CHAMPIONS**

Singapore Cricket Club (SCC) were crowned champions of the Singapore Football League (SFL) 2025 season on the evening of Sunday September 7th, clinching the title on the final matchday after a very close battle with two worthy opponents in both Jungfrau Punggol FC and Singapore Police Sports Association. Heading into the last round of fixtures on the 7th of September, all three sides were still in contention, with SCC and Jungfrau level on 29 points apiece, and Police just behind on 28. Victory was essential for any of the trio to keep their title hopes alive.



At Jurong East Stadium, SCC took on Katong FC knowing only three points would suffice. Despite early pressure from their opponents, SCC struck twice just before the interval through Timothy Cheng and Keefe Soon. They held firm in the second half to secure a 2-0 win and put themselves in pole position.

With both SCC and Jungfrau finishing level on 32 points, it was SCC's stronger defensive record - conceding just 10 goals across 14 matches and registering six clean sheets - that proved decisive. Police's defeat meant they had to settle for third place, while SCC lifted the trophy for the third time since 2010.

In fact, Kim Leng and Kian Ann - both members of the 2010 championship team - have, along with the esteemed Steven Tan, been instrumental in developing the 2025 SFL squad into a title-winning side. It should be noted that back in April, the SCC team also claimed the 2025 Challenge Cup marking their first piece of silverware this season, now accompanied by another impressive addition to the Club's trophy cabinet in the Padang Restaurant.

The Section started with regular friendly matches on Sundays, but its first true challenge was the POT Games against Tanglin Club on 25 September 2022. At the end of the first round of five matches, the teams were drawn 2.5 points each, but the SCC had had the better of the play.

Prost, everyone! We'll see you again next year!






































