

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear Members,

I extend my sincere thanks to members for their patience and understanding during the various upgrading events over the past few months. I apologise for the inconvenience and ask for further indulgence as the Club management works towards delivering an improved experience for all members.

The temporary closure of The Padang Restaurant was necessary to overhaul the air-conditioning system; the now-cooler environment will further enhance members' experience in our fine-dining venue.

In the meanwhile construction work on the permanent canopy at The Courtyard continues. Completion is targeted for October 2025; however following that there are the necessary government inspections and approvals which will need to be sought and members will be updated on the date when the Courtyard can be opened for use.

At the same time, the SCC Dempsey development project is progressing; while some individual construction has been completed, the temporary occupation licences will take some time

Members will find a more detailed and illustrated update within this issue.

SCC's celebration of Singapore's 60th birthday was a lively festive affair, and now the NDP stands on the Padang are coming down to be replaced by the set-up for the Singapore Formula One Grand Prix happening 3 – 5 October 2025. Our management and staff look forward to welcoming members and guests to an even bigger and better SCC Night Race weekend of adrenaline-racing party action.

The party will continue the following week with the SCC Oktoberfest Music Festival on 10 October – look forward to a festive night with a lot of beer and other beverages, a full German buffet dinner, and a great live music line-up with a Bavarian oompah band, party band, and DJ mixing. This Oktoberfest will take place under a specially constructed tent on the MPC, so do support and join the rest of the SCC family for what will be a memorable night.

The next major Club event will be the 76th SCC International Rugby7s Tournament 2025 on 15 – 16 November. We've already confirmed 16 teams who will descend on the Padang from as far as Sweden, the UK, Australia, Japan, Papua New Guinea and Malaysia, as well as Singapore teams including our own SCC Rugby team. With an expanded corporate hospitality tent, there will be more opportunities for members to entertain business associates at the world's second oldest rugby7s event while watching the exciting sporting action that will be on display – do refer to the Sports News section of this issue for more information.

Our SCC Women's Hockey teams did well at the National Hockey League 2025 – with the FBT's Women Hockey League 1 Team coming in as the first runner up and the Women Hockey League 2 Team the second runner up. They also excelled in many categories at the Pesta Sukan Hockey 5s 2025: SCC Mixed Gold Team and SCC Masters O35 Women Team were champions in their categories while the SCC Men's Open Team were first runner up in their category and the SCC Women's Open Team were second runner in theirs. Our younger hockey talents also did well, winning in the U21 Boys and U21 Girls categories, and being first runner up in the U17 Girls and U15 Girls categories.

At the MARIGOLD Singapore Squash Championship 2025, Aaron Liang won the Men's Open title while Jerome Aw came in as runner up and Simmy Ong also won runner up in the Women's Open. Our SCC squash players also represented Singapore at the Southeast Asian Squash Cup 2025: Jerome Aw and Aaron Liang were part of the Mixed Team that won gold, while Jerome also won bronze in the Men's Singles.

SCC Tennis teams won in the Ladies' A and Men's C categories at the STA Edwin Lee Yong Chuan Cup 2025. SCC Netball's Eagles team came in second at the Singlife National League 2025 – Club Women Division 3B category. Our male Bowlers were the champions at the National Fours Championship 2025, while the ladies' team won the joint bronze medal. Scott Lim came in third in the Pesta Sukan Pickleball Open Men's Singles, while SCC Pickleball Captain Ed Bentley chalked up another personal best at the English Open 2025; Champion in the 15+y Dynamic Universal Pickleball Rating (DUPR) 3.0 Pickleball Open Men's Double!

Three of our Squash JSMs – Jerome Aw, Rehaan Singh and Naisha Singh – received the Singapore Olympic Foundation's Peter Lim Scholarship that supports young and promising student-athletes. SCC Football Academy came in third in the U14 category at the Singapore Youth Summer Football Cup 2025.

The 47th Annual POT Games will have started on 23 August with Tennis competing at Tanglin Club – this year's host. Various games will be held in September: Chess, Cricket (friendly), Mahjong, Golf, Balut, Bridge, Darts, Pickleball, Billiards, Squash and Bowls. Remembering Bill Gartshore (8 November 1942 - 31 July 2025)



SCC Life Member, William "Bill" Gartshore, passed away peacefully on Thursday, 31 July 2025 and is dearly missed by Lily, his partner of more than 20 years, and fondly remembered by his many friends in Singapore.

He arrived in Singapore in January 1978 to work for Batey Advertising as an account director where he convinced the world that the Singapore Girl was a great way to fly.

Bill left Batey in the early 1980s to be a founding partner in Gartshore Kerr & Lim and shortly after started one of the few independent local advertising agencies, Gartshore & Associates. After 30 years in advertising, Bill finally called it quits in 2018 to focus on his own publications including writing the best-selling "An Essential Guide to Singlish".

Bill was an avid squasher and served as Convenor of the Squash Section in the early 1980s and went on to serve on the General Committee of the SCC for several years. Bill was conferred Life Membership of the SCC for his services to the Club.

Bill's penchant for writing and his razor-sharp wit saw Bill writing the scripts and directing the hilarious Squash Section skits performed at the themed SCC Club Nights (Vicars & Tarts, Doctors & Nurses, Angels & Devils, The Lion King), the monthly club-wide party organised by each Section in turn in the 1980s.

Outside of work, Bill was a lifelong Arsenal FC supporter, an active freemason, a prolific squash player at SCC and the Tanglin Club, a regular golfer at Raffles and Sentosa and an active hasher with Lion City and Seletar. Invariably in all these organisations, the social side of Bill came to the fore when he undertook took active roles on their Management Committees.

The man who never had a harsh word for anyone, the consummate Club gentlemen will be missed by many. Rest in peace, Bill.




