The 32nd SEA Games 2023 was hosted by Cambodia from 5 - 17 May 2023, with a total of 558 Team Singapore athletes competing across 30 sports at the Games. This included 21 SCC members who represented Singapore in Billiards, Hockey Men's, Hockey Ladies, Tennis, Men's Cricket and Ladies' Cricket. In this issue, we'll get to know four such members as they speak to us.

#### REZZA GAZNAVI - CAPTAIN, SEA GAMES MEN'S CRICKET TEAM

#### When and how did you start playing cricket?

Since I was three or four years old, my father would bring me along for his cricket games. He was already a member of the Singapore Cricket Club then and was playing for them. You would see this small kid running around amongst the SCC men; that kid was me. I would wait impatiently and some might say with schadenfreude for my father to get out so that he could divert his attention to throwing balls to me or so that I could bowl to him.

I suppose I picked it up subconsciously. As a child, your mind and body are pliable. You are willing to try new things. You learn fast. The entire world is a learning ground. I remember thinking if I threw the ball in a certain way, the ball would behave in one way. If I threw it in another way, it would do something else. Doing it repeatedly, you develop a relationship with the ball, a sort of intuition. This was the case with me for other ball sports too.

In hindsight, it was a combination of observing, experimenting with getting my hands dirty, failing, and trying all over again, much to the chagrin of my parents!

# What was your experience captaining the Singapore Men's Cricket Team for this SEA Games 2023 and did it differ from previous national captaining stints?

It is always an honour and privilege to represent your country. Captaincy carries with it greater responsibilities. In my opinion, a cricket captain is more significant than the other captains in the sporting world. I say this with modesty. His skills, both soft and hard, directly affect the game like no other captain.

Before you step into the field, the captain and his support staff have a plan in mind but when the captain steps into the field, most times nothing goes according to plan and he has to react and think on his feet alone. He makes the decisions in the field without aid and the luxury of time. He decides what fields should be set for which bowler according to how the batsman is batting; he decides which bowler should bowl at which stage of the game.

I grew up captaining my school teams - Victoria School and Raffles Institution - Club teams, and the Singapore youth teams. What was different with the SEA Games was that the stakes were higher. There were medals on the line. There was a lot more media coverage. In a way, there was greater pressure.



In general, captaincy at the Men's level is a different ball game. You are asked more in the man management and tactical aspects of the game. You deal with 15 other personalities. The game moves faster and the margins for error are smaller.

# How do you juggle your playing career, professional career as a litigator, and personal life?

Through osmosis from my mother! My mother teaches. She is a great cook. A greater wife. A better mother to her six children than a wife to her husband. I learnt from her the art of time-management. I am a practising Muslim and Islam advocates time-management with the five daily prayers.

#### VALERIE KOH - SEA GAMES WOMEN'S FIELD HOCKEY PLAYER

#### When did you first represent Singapore in field hockey?

I first donned the national flag when I was 14 years old in the U14 Milo Cup in Malaysia.

#### How often were you training and what other things were you doing to prepare for the SEA Games?

We train five times a week and had hockey league matches on most weekends. There were many practice matches and training trips in preparation for the SEA Games as well.

#### What was the best advice you were ever given?

The best advice I had was "Do the best you can until you know better. Then when you know better, do better." This quote has had many different meanings to me. I think first of all that it's a reminder to constantly be improving. It's inevitable to not know everything, but what you do to gain new knowledge and how you process those experiences makes a world of difference. It's also a reminder to be kind to others - they themselves are often trying their best too. Most importantly, it's to be kind to yourself. Making mistakes and having regrets is part and parcel of the journey - embrace it and just "Do Better"!

#### What are your hopes and aspirations for your future as a hockey player?

I hope to enjoy my hockey playing career and go where my journey leads me. Definitely though, I hope to be able to go to Asian Games in the future!



What are your favourite foods at SCC?

My favorite foods at SCC are the spicy minced lamb pizza and cheese cubes - super delicious.

It is demanding. I do not sleep much. Playing for your country calls for such sacrifices. Cricket is a highly skilled sport, and you need to get your repetitions in. I carve out two or three slots in a week to hone my cricketing skills. At the higher levels, fitness is a gamechanger. That too requires consistent hard work. I sneak in gym sessions whenever possible. It is no secret that diet is the door to fitness and in my mind, fasting is the key. Fasting reaps you the greatest health rewards and increases productivity. I fast on Mondays and Thursdays to ensure that the desk-bound lifestyle in the office does not result in me ingesting unnecessary calories.

On to business end of things - I work with my father at Mahmood Gaznavi Chambers LLC. He tells me that nothing should compromise my work. To achieve that, I get into office at 7am. Litigation is adversarial and requires extraordinary amounts of time and effort. You work weekends and long hours daily. You have to craft arguments and prepare submissions. Your mind is on high alert. Simply put, it is intellectual boxing (that has no predetermined rounds)! But again, I truly enjoy and welcome the challenge. I think of it as a means to constantly challenge and consequently, improve myself in the intellectual dimension.

I am newly married and spend most of my time outside of cricket and work with my wife. I am glad I found a companion in her. My family, by God's grace, is a close unit. My friends are friends with my family members too. Somehow, they all coalesce to form my world and support system.

I have come to realise that when you break things down to its most rudimentary form, the only currency we have in this world is time, and our life is what we spend of that time.

In short, I draw boundaries and decide that I would use my limited currency with the things that matter to me - family, friends, work, and cricket. No Instagram, no Facebook, no unnecessary Netflix dramas!

#### What would you consider to be your biggest achievement in Cricket so far?

On a leadership level, it would be winning the ACC Under-15 Elite Cup in Nepal in 2005. I was captain and it was the first time a Singapore youth team ever won a competition on the international level. I was also the tournament's highest run scorer. Winning medals at the recent SEA Games and the one in 2017 trail closely behind.

I was particularly happy with the unbeaten 86 I scored against Malaysia in the finals of SEA Games Men's 50 Over competition in 2017. Singapore was in a spot of bother at 30-3 in the 11th over, and I walked in to bat. I got hit on my left forearm with the first ball I faced by a quick bowler. I thought to myself "It can't get any worse than this." I eventually brought the team score to 195 without getting out. Unfortunately, we did not win that game.

Another that ranks highly for me was the unbeaten 140 runs I scored against SCC at SCC in the Premier Division. I was playing against SCC because there was a structure then where the youths of the national team would play together for Kallang Colts to give us exposure. We ended up beating SCC quite convincingly!

#### Besides cricket, what do you enjoy doing at the Club?

The food! My wife will vehemently agree. She adores the food and the ambiance of the Club. Every so often, we will find a guiet corner, order our food, and chit-chat.

I also meet and greet my clients at the Club. I studied in England where I made quite a few international friends. Whenever they would visit Singapore, invariably I would take them to the Club. The Club definitely ranks high up in my "gloating" list when I show my friends around Singapore.

#### **AUDREY TONG - SEA GAMES LADIES TENNIS PLAYER**

#### How did you get started playing tennis?

I started out playing tennis as a hobby to have some outdoor fun over the weekends, which eventually evolved into my playing tennis competitively, for weekend leagues, school, club, nationals and Singapore, and enjoying it a lot!

#### Are there any particular routines/ rituals you do the day before or the hours before a match?

Right before a match, I usually have my earphones in, and listen to music to get myself pumped up and focused on my match.

#### How was your experience competing on the court and off it at the SEA Games 2023?

Many of the athletes competing in the SEA Games are from all across Southeast Asia as some of the best players in their country and many of them will have had many years of experience and training in their sport.

For me as a younger athlete, competing with fellow athletes who are of such a high level was not easy, but I did my best and it was definitely a good learning experience for me! I also got to meet some of SG's top athletes and got chances to snap quick photos with some of them; truly a highlight of the trip!

#### What would be your ultimate achievement in sports?

It was an honour and privilege to be able to represent Singapore at this year's SEA Games, and to win my singles match after being a set down was an icing on the cake. I am very grateful for the support of Sports SG, SNOC and STA and all the supporters courtside at the SEA Games too!

#### How has your time as a Junior Sports Member at SCC helped support your sporting career?

Being a Junior Sports Member at SCC has given me the opportunity to play matches and practise with a wide range of players, something which has proven essential in my journey as a tennis player, as it allowed me to hone my skills and improve my match strategy against players with varied playing styles. Many of my tennis teammates at SCC are older than me and they have all been very kind to always include me in activities and look out for me.

#### HARIRAJ NAIDU - SEA GAMES MEN'S FIELD HOCKEY PLAYER

#### How did your interest in Hockey start?

My parents were both field hockey players, and my father was a former national hockey player. Naturally, I wanted to follow in their footsteps in the hopes of forging my own identity. My enthusiasm grew as I began competing for my school teams, St. Andrew's Primary and Secondary. It also makes me feel alive because of the people I've met through the sport, not to mention the culture that goes along with it.

#### You were recruited by Coach Kanan in 2016 to play for SCC; could you share about how that happened, how it was to start with the Club, meeting other members and playing/training with them?

My Father and Coach Kanan are good friends. And back then I was only able to commit officially to SCC in 2018, as my father thought that I was still young and inexperienced, which I agree with. As a newcomer, I attended my first league game in 2018. I'll never forget how friendly the team was; it was so genuine and heartwarming. To this day, I always tell others about my experience. I've never received such a warm welcome in a game, and the intensity of training was eye-opening for me.

The effort we put in, both on and off the field, propelled me to the level where I should be playing hockey, for which I am grateful. I'd like to express my gratitude to Ken and Dan, who have provided me with invaluable advice throughout my years of playing with them. Their shared experiences are something that I treasure.

#### It takes a lot to manage work and training at the same time – what drives that sporting passion?

I struggled at first with the intensity of training and the level of play on the field, but my passion for the game kept me going. I was desperate to achieve my goals and improve as a player. I'm grateful to my family, teammates, and friends for the support and encouragement they provide in keeping the flame alive.

#### What are some of your best memories of playing Hockey for Singapore?

It's difficult to pinpoint my "best memory" because every chance to compete for the national team means so much to me. However, if I had to choose one, I'd go back to the year 2018, when I made my first official debut in a tournament held in Singapore, my hometown. Furthermore, the 2023 SEA Games was one of my most memorable experiences because it was the first time I was at the SEA Games.

#### How did it feel playing in the SEA Games Field Hockey finals, listening to the national anthem broadcasted, and winning silver?

I loved it; it was thrilling, and the adrenaline rush is what makes the game so amazing. And to be very honest my heart was racing nonstop because it was my first SEA Games, and the atmosphere was incredibly intense; but no matter how hard it was, my team and I tried to shake it off.

To add on, our team had a strong desire for gold, like all teams, and we worked hard to get it. Despite our best efforts, we only received silver. Winning silver in my first SEA Games is a rare opportunity, and I am grateful for it and am overjoyed and proud to be able to play alongside my team, and I'm proud of how far we've come. And this will definitely be a stepping stone on my journey.







## **SCC Nature Trail Walk**

29 April 2023, Rifle Range Nature Park

SCC members gathered at 7:30 am at the entrance of Rifle Range Park and for some, it was their first nature trail walk with SCC. For most, however, it was their first time visiting this new park.

Our SCC member Ketki Sen kicked off the walk by giving the group a brief overview

of the history & significance of the park.

Rifle Range Park is an important park in Singapore's goal to be a "City in Nature" under the SGGreenPlan. It also serves as a green buffer to protect Bukit Timah Nature Reserve

from edge effects and abutting developments. It further enhances ecological connectivity and provides complementary habitats for the Nature Reserve's biodiversity. NParks has replanted native rainforest trees and turned the former granite quarry into a thriving freshwater habitat.

X-factor: Rifle Range is Singapore's first net positive energy nature park. Energy harvested from the solar panels installed around the nature park exceeds the expected annual operational energy consumption of the site.

#### Highlights of our visit to the park:

We explored the nature park via the 7km network of boardwalks and trails that cater to people of all ages and abilities. Many of these trails retrace the paths that were left by kampung villagers in the 1950s. Our route covered Rambai Boardwalk, Gliders Boardwalk, Quarry Wetland, Waterhen Hide and up the Colugo Trail. The group opted to take the tougher route up clambering over the huge steps to reach the viewing deck, nearly 10 storeys high, which gives a bird's eye view of the area. This was the perfect spot to take some group photos as well!

While walking around, we spotted random poles with ropes across them. These form an aerial rope bridge for animals such as squirrels to walk across without getting hurt or interrupted by human activity.

The walk through the Banyan and Gaharu Trail was more rustic and quaint as the group took the steps across the waters.

The last trail we took was the Forest Exploration Trail. In this play area for children, logs and boulders create a material connection with nature and enable children to hone their balancing skills as they climb, balance, or jump over the logs. And that's exactly what the SCC group did, testing their balancing skills & more!

We kept a look out for the animals that are known to be found at Rifle Range: civets, colugos, flying squirrels, and the critically endangered Sunda pangolins! While we did not spot any during this walk, it sure was a lovely way to appreciate how Rifle Range stands as an example of how we can prioritize green spaces in Singapore and establish new ones in the future.

#### AGAINST THE ODDS - SCC MASTERS WIN THE EFL SUPER VETS OVER-45 LEAGUE

The date, Saturday, 25 February 2023. Sitting at fifth place in our debut season of the eight-team EFL Super Vets Over-45 League 2022/23, things looked bleak. We had only eight games left of the gruelling 21-week long season. Fresh from a 3-1 loss — our sixth defeat — with a loss of form, piling injuries, interruptions due to travel, the loss of our Dempsey pitch and team morale taking a beating, our hope — at best — was to gather enough players to finish the season as a mid-table team, fourth place being a bonus.

But something changed after that week, and everything clicked. A couple of new players were added — some returning from a long injury, others from long travels. We knew a change of approach to matches was needed to refresh the squad and get us back on track. And with that, a winning team was formed.

But first, two tricky fixtures against last year's winners, the Pirates, and league leaders, the British Club Vets. We managed a hard-fought win and draw, which gave us enough belief that if we continued with that desire, game management and went on a winning run, there was a glimmer of possibility that we could win the league. The problem was that we needed to win all our remaining six games to go level on points, and we needed goals to give us an edge should it come to goal difference. A not entirely, but almost, impossible feat.

One match at a time, each week we played like it was a cup final — because to us, it literally was. Any one loss or draw, would instantly take us out of the running to be champions.

1-0 down and we came out 2-1 winners against the Hibs Legends on the Padang. Back-to-back wins against CBD Rangers and the Pirates, a last-minute winning goal gave us renewed hope and confidence. We won our next matches 6-1 and 8-0 respectively; that put us in prime position to win the league — but only if we won our final match of the season against the Hibs Legends. 

Do you know that Mahjong made its debut out of China in the 1900's? It is now played in USA, Europe, Australia, Japan, South Korea and Southeast Asia. Be it true beginner or advanced player, we welcome you all to our SCC Mahjong Section.

#### A QUICK INTRODUCTION TO MAHJONG

A typical Mahjong set consists of 148 tiles with different suits - Circles, Characters, Bamboo and Winds/Dragons. For the Singapore style, there are four more special tiles: Cat, Mouse, Chicken and Centipede. Out of these 148, each individual has to form the best combination of tiles, using only 14 of them to game. On a basic level, these 14 tiles should contain four sets and a pair of "eyes". A set can be in the form of a straight like 5 Circles, 6 Circles, 7 Circles or triplet (3 of the exact same tiles).
