#### 25 September 2023

The Special General Meeting (SGM) of the Singapore Cricket Club was conducted on 25 September 2023 at The Padang Restaurant.

Chairman Mathavan Devadas called the meeting to order at 6.30pm and electronic voting was opened shortly after. With all businesses of the SGM concluded, the Chairman declared the meeting closed at 9.05pm.

NOTICE OF RESOLUTION TENDERED PURSUANT TO RULE 59 OF THE RULES OF THE SINGAPORE CRICKET CLUB

#### **RESOLUTION ONE**

#### **CLUB HOUSE AND PADANG LEASE RENEWAL**

To approve the capital expenditure of S\$11.9 million and the applicable GST payable, stamp duty and any other incidental fees and/or expenses arising out of or in respect of a new Lease of the Club House and the Open Space known as the Padang and consequently with such approval to authorise the General Committee to take the necessary steps and/or actions to terminate the existing lease and to secure the new Lease accordingly.

UPDATE: On 19 September 2023, SLA responded to our request and reduced the Lease Renewal Premium by S\$1 million to S\$10.9m. This has also reduced the GST and estimated Stamp Duty.





#### SCC QUIZ NIGHT





Philo said she hoped "...with this bronze in hand, the quality of competition will improve, and the sport of bowls will get to be a lot more popular in Singapore."



#### **WORLD BOWLS 2023**

"Getting selected to represent Singapore in any form is a privilege. I had the honour of representing Singapore in the recent World Bowls Championships 2023 held in Gold Coast, Australia from 29 August to 10 September 2023.

World Bowls Championship is the premier competition in Lawn Bowls. It is THE tournament where all the best players from around the world come to compete.
